

Iran Martial Artists Crested in International Tournament

ANKARA (Press TV) - Iranian athletes have put on an impressive display of skills and stood on the top of the podium at the fourth edition of World Martial Arts Festival in Turkey.

The final day of the competitions in the city of Istanbul, Iran's Muay Thai team, consisting of Saeed Chahardeli, Moslem Lashni, Amin Ahmadi and Qaem Torkashvand, lifted the trophy at the Bağcılar

Olympic Sport Hall. Host nation, Turkey, trailed the Islamic Republic of Iran and was followed by European powerhouse, Russia.

Muay Thai is a combat sport of Thailand that uses stand-up striking along with various clinching techniques. It includes combat on shins and is known as "the art of eight limbs." The discipline is characterized by the combined use of fists, elbows, knees and shins. Iranian vovinam squad also ended its campaign at the 4th World Martial Arts Festival with a welldeserved win, and was crowned as the champion of the discipline.

Turkish and Russian vovinam practitioners stood in the second and third spots respectively, behind their Iranian opponents.

Vovinam is a Vietnamese martial art, which uses force and reaction of the rival. It also includes hand, elbow, kicks, escape- and levering techniques.

Lakers Rookie Randle to Miss Rest of Season

WASHINGTION (China Daily) -Los Angeles Lakers could be without their rookie forward Julius Randle for the rest of the season after the seventh overall pick broke his right leg in the season opener on Tuesday.

"Randle is expected to make a full recovery, although it is anticipated that he will miss the remainder of the 2014-15 season," the Lakers said on their website.

The 19-year-old Randle sustained the injury in the first regular season game of his career in which the Lakers were beaten 108-90 by the Houston Rockets. Randle had a surgery on Wednesday.

The Lakers have been already without their veteran guard Steve Nash, who is expected to miss the career for back problems.



Gucci Among Strikers Set to Score A BagFul in Asian Cup

TEHRAN (Persian League) -Iran's Reza Ghoochannejhad has been mentioned among the five strikers who could set Asia's biggest football tournament alight.

The 2015 AFC Asian Cup will be held in Australia from January 9 to 31

Iran has been pitted against the United Arab Emirates (UAE), Qatar and Bahrain in Group C of the tournament.

Iran striker Ghoochannejhad will vie with four more strikers to become the tournament's top goalscorers.

When Carlos Queiroz became manager of Iran in 2011, he made an effort to bring members of the Iranian diaspora into the national team. One of these players was

Reza Ghoochannejhad, a striker who was born in Iran but grew up in the Netherlands.

After playing for the Dutch youth sides, Ghoochannejhad made his debut for Iran in 2012. Since then, the man nicknamed 'Gucci' has become a hit in Iran after scoring 10 goals in 11 matches for the national team. He played a crucial part in Iran's qualification for the Asian Cup, and scored Iran's only goal in the 2014 World Cup, afcasiancup. com wrote.

Japanese striker Shinji Okazaki Tim Cahill from Australia, South Korean Son Heung-min and Saudi Arabian Nasser Al-Shamrani are the other candidates, who could become the top scorer of the tournament.
