Galatasaray Sign Arsenal Striker Podolski

ANKARA ((Anadolu Agency)_ Turkish reigning Super Toto Super League champions Galatasaray have signed German wing forward Lukas Podolski from English Premier League club Arsenal.

Turkish side announced on their official website Saturday that the 30-year-old German international has agreed to a three plus one-year contract with the Lions on a transfer fee of 2.5 million euros.

"Galatasaray are winners of the last season and will also play in the Champions League this season. My goal is to exert all my energy and effort for Galatasaray," he told a press conference after the signing ceremony at Turk Telekom Arena in Istanbul.

The Poland-born German player is set to receive 11.3 million euros during his term in Galatasaray, according to a statement he was loaned to Inter Milan,

from the club.

In the last three years he played for the Gunners, "Poldi" had 82 appearances at the Emirates Stadium in London, where he scored 31 goals and produced 17 assists. This year in January,

England Create History With Germany Win

OTTAWA (FIFA) - England outlasted two-time champions Germany in extra time to secure third-place thanks to a lone Fara Williams penalty.

It was a first-ever win for England over Germany in 21 attempts after a match of endto-end action and endeavour from both teams.

The action started on eight minutes as a Tabea Kemme's cross caused chaos for England, forcing Steph Houghton to hook clear off the line just moments after receiving treatment for an ankle injury.

Chile Beats Argentina, Wins Copa América for 1st Time

SANTIAGO (Press TV) - Host Chile has beaten Argentina 4-1 on penalties to win Copa América for the first time in a dramatic shoot-out in Santiago.

After 120 minutes of a goalless but heated final between two of the best teams of the tourney at Estadio Nacional Julio Martínez Prádanos, Arsenal forward Alexis Sánchez chipped the winning penalty for the hosts to win their first major trophy on Saturday.

Gonzalo Higuaín and his teammate Éver Banega missed penalties in the shoot-out, which was followed by La Roja's winning penalty and celebration with thousands of fans present at the stadium in the Chilean capital Santiago.

In spite of Argentinian captain Lionel Messi's only score from the spot, Gerardo Martino's squad emerged second at the tournament and ended La Albiceleste's 22-year quench for a trophy drought.

Greece, Turkey Look to Bounce Back in **Battle for Third Place**

HERAKLION (FIBA) - Greece and Turkey will look to shake off differing Semi-Final losses at the 2015 FIBA U19 World Championship as they face off in Sunday's Third-Place Game.

Greece have a chance to finish on the podium for a fourth time and pull into sole possession of second place on the all-time list of top-three placings in the competition. The United States will pick up their ninth top-two showing while Serbia and Lithuania have finished on the podium three times.

Turkey reached the Semi-Finals for the first time and therefore are shooting for their first podium finish.

Turkey face a major uphill battle after being demolished by an essentially six-man Croatia team, losing 91-56 and being dominated in nearly every category. Turkey must find their heart if they are to beat the Greeks again after knocking them off 68-64 in the group stage of the 2014 U18 European Championship en route to the title.

Tournament hosts Greece meanwhile gave a valiant effort but came up just short against the reigning champions United States, losing 82-76.

The six-point game was the closest the USA had thus far in the tournament and was Greece's first defeat. The hosts will have the home crowd on their side as they look to add another piece of hardware to their title in 1995, second place in 2009 and third in 2003.
