Yemen Exposes Saudi Hypocrisy

The hypocrisy of the regime in Riyadh has been fully exposed by the lies uttered last Saturday from the UN podium by Adel Jubeir, the foreign minister of Saudi Arabia ironically on the very day (September 23) this entity was created by Britain in 1932 for its salaried agent, Abdul-Aziz, the desert brigand from Najd, seven years after the Wahhabi Chief's occupation of the Land of Revelation (Hijaz) by unleashing torrents of Muslim blood in the holy cities of Mecca and Medina, the port city of Jeddah and the mountainous resort of Ta'ef, and blasphemously demolishing the sanctities of Islam.

When the Zionist-looking Jubeir, who openly speaks of convergence of views with the illegal Zionist entity (Israel) and who makes no pretensions of his regime's detestation for Hamas and the Palestinian liberation movements, said at the 72nd UN General Assembly session in New York "my country is gravely concerned and condemns the policy of repression and forced displacement carried out by the government of Myanmar against the Rohingya minority", the audience exchanged wry smiles of disbelief.

Prompt came a jolt from Yemen, which for almost the past three years is under relentless aerial bombardment of US-backed Saudi Arabia, which has destroyed the infrastructure of the Arab World's poorest country, killed almost 20,000 men, women and children, and displaced millions of Yemeni Muslims – catastrophic figures that pale into insignificance when compared to the atrocities of the Myanmar regime against the Rohingya Muslims.

The popular Ansarallah Movement which the Wahhabi regime thought would be bludgeoned into submission in a couple of weeks, but has surprised the world by turning Yemen into Saudi Arabia's Vietnam, mocked Jubeir's statement of pretension of support for Rohingya Muslims by reminding him how brutally his own regime is killing Yemeni Muslims.

Ansarallah spokesman Mohammad Abdus-Salaam, said Sunday on the Arabic-language al-Masirah television network: "The Saudi-led coalition deserves the Nobel Peace Prize due to its crimes in Yemen."

It was an apparent dig at Myanmar's supposedly democratic leader, Aung Sang Suu Kyi, a Nobel laureate whose support for her regime's ongoing atrocities against Rohingya Muslims has drawn international outcry, prompting the Leader of the Islamic Revolution, Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei, to denounce her as a "cruel woman".

The Leader had said: "The (Myanmar) government is led by a brutal woman who has been awarded the Nobel peace prize; these developments, in fact, have sounded the death knell for the Nobel peace prize."

As usual, Jubeir in his UN speech heaped lies upon the Islamic Republic. In a clumsy attempt to distract attention from Iran's exemplary role in supporting the people and governments of Syria and Iraq by saving Damascus and Baghdad from imminent fall into the hands of the cannibalistic Takfiri terrorists (created by the unholy triangle of Riyadh-Washington-Tel Aviv), he alleged that Tehran was supporting terrorism.

The hypocrisy was crystal clear. Terrorists in the jargon of the Wahhabis are elected (not installed) governments, popular liberation movements and the Muslim masses who support them by firmly opposing the desecration of Islamic sites and distortion of Islamic laws by the Godless Takfiris.

FM Zarif: U.S. Unpredictable and Unreliable

TEHRAN (Dispatches) – Iranian Foreign Minister Muhammad Javad Zarif has ripped the U.S. as “unreliable” in the wake of a report saying the Trump administration was leaning toward decertifying the nuclear deal with Tehran.

“I think what the United States is doing in addition to being unpredictable, which might sometimes work, is proving that it is unreliable,” Zarif said Sunday on CNN’s “Fareed Zakaria GPS.”

“This deal is not a bilateral agreement. It’s not even a multilateral treaty; it’s a Security Council resolution. And the United States is a permanent member of the Security Council,” he added.

“What is important for the international community is to be able to rely on the words of the United States as a negotiation partner,” he said, adding that Iran in the nuclear deal “accepted certain concessions and the United States accepted certain concessions.”

Zarif’s comments come after President Trump used his debut speech at the UN General Assembly last

week to slam the deal, calling it an “embarrassment.”

“The Iran deal was one of the worst and most one-sided transactions the United States has ever entered into,” Trump said in the remarks. “Frankly, that deal is an embarrassment to the United States, and I don’t think you have heard the last of it, believe me.”

Iran announced on Saturday that it had successfully conducted the test of a new ballistic missile design, and pledged to continue shoring up its defensive means.

Zarif was asked about Iran’s reaction to Trump’s possible withdrawal from the agreement or its decertification.

The foreign minister said if the U.S. withdrew from the 2015 multilateral nuclear deal, the Islamic Republic could walk away from the accord and resume its peaceful nuclear activities.

“Iran has a number of options, which include walking away from the deal and going back with greatest speed with its nuclear program, which will remain peaceful but

which will not address and accept the limitations that we voluntarily accepted over our nuclear program.”

The Trump administration has twice certified Iranian compliance with the deal in notifications to the U.S. Congress under an American law. But it has signaled that a third verification — due in mid-October — would not be forthcoming.

Zarif said the certification is not part of the deal, but rather a US internal procedure, adding that the only authority that has been recognized to verify the nuclear deal is the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA).

The foreign minister also touched on Iran’s missile power, saying the country is developing its own defenses instead of buying billions of dollars worth of the so-called beautiful military equipment from the U.S.

Zarif was referring to U.S. President Donald Trump’s remarks before a meeting with Qatari Emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani back in May, when he said, “One o

Ambassador al-Mousavi:

Iraq Cannot Defeat Enemies Without Iran

TEHRAN (Tasnim) – The Iraqi ambassador to Iran on Sunday praised the Islamic Republic for its continued support for the Arab country’s campaign against terrorism and said Baghdad cannot defeat its enemies without Tehran.

Iran is helping to resolve problems facing the Islamic world, including Iraq, through providing defense and scientific support, Rajeh Saber Abboud al-Mousavi said in a speech in the Iranian central city of Qom.

“For that reason, Iraq is always indebted to Iran,” the diplomat added.

The envoy also emphasized that Iraq cannot gain victory over its enemies without the Islamic Republic.

Iraq has been facing the growing threat of terrorism, mainly posed by the terrorist Daesh group.

Daesh militants made swift advances in much of northern and western Iraq over the summer of 2014, after capturing large swaths of northern Syria.

However, a combination of concentrated attacks by the Iraqi military and the volunteer forces, who rushed to take arms after top Iraqi cleric Ayatollah Ali al-Sistani issued a fatwa calling for the fight against the militants, have blunted the edge of Daesh offensive.

Amid tensions in Iraq, Iran is known as the first country to help the Arab country and has always voiced support for Iraq’s solidarity and prosperity.

Leader’s Aide: Trump Unlikely to Serve Out Full Term

TEHRAN (Dispatches) – A senior military commander on Sunday blasted President Donald Trump’s anti-Iran remarks at the UN General Assembly in New York, saying the American people are unlikely to see him serve to the end of his tenure.

“I believe that the 350 million Americans who listened to their president’s remarks were ashamed,” Yahya Rahim Safavi, a senior military advisor to Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei said. “I think that Trump has prob-

lems psychologically, politically and in common sense and rationale; he is an unbalanced figure. I think that the American people will not tolerate his 4-year-long presidency,” Safavi told reporters here.

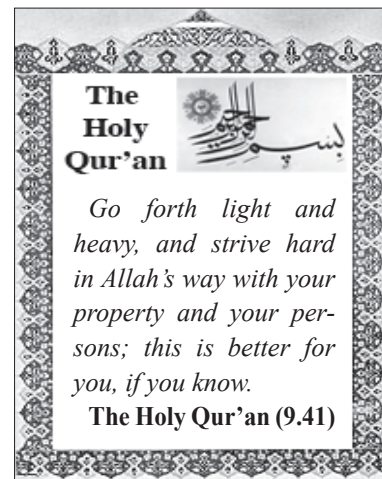
The former chief commander of the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) said only the occupying regime of Israel’s premier Benjamin Netanyahu lauded Trump’s speech while other leaders denounced it. Iranian Parliament Speaker Ali

Larijani also said Trump has not realized the changes in the world.

“Trump doesn’t realize that the world has changed, and considering his mental capacity he won’t seem to ever understand the fact,” Larijani said told an open session of the parliament.

He pointed to an agreement signed between Tehran and the six world powers and said, “Whether this is embarrassing to Trump or not, is not our problem.”

IRGC’s Second in Command: World Arrogance Trying to Alter Geopolitical Map

TEHRAN (Dispatches) – A senior commander of Iran’s Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) on Monday highlighted the significance of maintaining security across the region, warning of plots to alter the world’s geopolitical map.

“The global arrogance and its allies are making efforts to change the world’s geopolitical map,” Brigadier General Hussein Salami, the IRGC’s second in command, said.

Security is very important in Iran’s defense system, particularly at a time when centers of insecurity and crisis have been formed in the Islamic Republic’s neighboring countries and the strategy of hegemonic countries, such as the United States, Britain and some of their allies in the region, is to make geopolitical changes in the world, he added.

The senior IRGC commander emphasized that Iran monitored all moves by its enemies while at the same time displaying its defensive preparedness to establish full security, particularly in border areas.

He pointed to security drills that started on Sunday by the IRGC ground forces, saying that Iran possessed adequate weapons to counter any possible ground, sea and aerial attacks on the country.

Salami noted that during the ongoing drills, the IRGC ground forces had managed to successfully improve coordination among various defense units.
