Official: Tens of EU Firms Ready for Cooperation With Iran's Oil Industry



TEHRAN (FNA) - Head of the Society of Iranian Petroleum Industries Equipment Manufacturers Reza Khayyamian said on Saturday that dozens of European companies have voiced willingness to cooperate with Iran in developing its oil industry despite U.S. sanctions.

"Up to 110 small and mid-sized European companies have declared preparedness to start joint ventures with Iranian firms and start operation in Iran's oil and gas industries," Khayyamian said.

He said that Iran intends to invite the European companies to hold talks with fellow Iranian firms to start joint ventures to implement projects in the country.

Despite the re-imposition of the U.S.

sanctions against Iran, many European and Asian companies have voiced enthusiasm for cooperation with the country.

The German ADL company inked an agreement with Iran's Sepahan Oil Company (SOC) in August to cooperate in technology transfer.

CEO of Iran's SOC Mohammad Ebrahimi and CEO of Germany's ADL Michael Hyde signed the cooperation document despite the US unilateral sanctions against Iran and its withdrawal from the 2015 nuclear deal. According to the cooperation document signed between SOC and ADL, the two sides would cooperate in technology transfer in the field of oil and gas industry lubricants.

The European embassies made lots of efforts to pave the way for signing the agreement, Ebrahimi said.

ADL will implement the project in cooperation with its Austrian and Swiss partners, he added.

India Set to Start Rupee-Rial **Payment for Chabahar Port**

TEHRAN (MNA) - India's Shipping Secretary Gopal Krishna said the country is weighing a rupeerial payment mechanism for the Chabahar project in Iran as it weaves a way around the U.S.'s impending sanctions against Iran from Nov. 4, to kickstart the port.

According to India media, Krishna said, "We are trying for a rupee-rival payment mechanism for Chabahar port project."

"Basically, the guarantees will have to be given in rupees now instead of in dollars or euros," he added.

The issue was discussed with a high-level delegation led by Mohammad Rastad, deputy Minister and Managing Director for Ports and Maritime Organization, Islamic Republic of Iran, during a visit to India earlier this week. The plan to set up an alternative payment mechanism reveals that India is willing to go ahead with the project even if the diplomatic lobbying for a waiver from the U.S. on Chabahar port project fails to yield results.

India's bid to start commercial operations at the port has been held up due to banking challenges arising from the fresh round of sanctions imposed by the U.S.

India has picked Bandar Abbasbased Kaveh Port and Marine



Services company to run the port as a stop-gap arrangement for 18 months till a full-fledged manage, operate and maintain (MOM) contractor is finalized by India Ports Global Pvt Ltd.

"Kaveh Port and Marine Services will start operations on our behalf and we should be ready to make payments to them. But, at present, due to banking difficulties we are not ready. There are banking issues on how to transfer funds and so it is on hold," a government official said.

"A rupee-rial payment mechanism is the only way out of this," said Arun Kumar Gupta, Managing Director, India Ports Global. "That is what we are working on. Instead of dollars or euros, all payments to the Iranian side will be under rupeerial mechanism," he said adding that a team from India Ports Global will visit Iran in the next few days to "work out things"

"Irrespective of the sanctions, we are trying to go ahead with the project; a new payment system will have to be put in place," he stated.

India Ports Global and Aria Banader Iranian Port signed a deal in May 2016 to equip and operate container and multi-purpose terminals at Shahid Beheshti -Chabahar Port Phase-I with capital investment of \$85.21 million and annual revenue expenditure of \$22.95 million on a 10-year lease.

Located in the Sistan-Baluchistan Province on Iran's Southeastern coast, Chabahar port is of great strategic importance for development of regional maritime transit traffic to Afghanistan and Central Asia.

Azerbaijan-Iran Joint Car Plant to Export to Russia, Georgia

Khazar Car Factory, located in southeast Azerbaijan in the Neftchala Industrial district, currently offers its products in Azerbaijan, however, the company eyes securing its footprints in foreign markets including Russia, Ukraine and the Commonwealth of Independent States.

Khazar joint car manufacturing factory was established in March 2018 during a state visit by Iranian President Hassan Rouhani to Azerbaijan. He was accompanied by his Azeri counterpart Ilham Aliyev during the inauguration ceremony.

The joint venture has targeted an initial annual output of 6,000 vehicles, with the number envisaged to rise up to 50,000.

The models which are manufactured at the factory are family cars popular in Iran, including Dena, Runna and Samand.

EU Urges Deeper Cuts to France's Long-Term Deficit



BRUSSELS (Reuters) - The European Commission has told France, Spain, Belgium, Portugal and Slovenia that their 2019 budget proposals did not meet recommended targets for cutting longer-term deficit cycles, but Paris played

down the criticism.

As part of its role to police euro zone budgets and avoid crises that can threaten the currency area, the Commission sent letters to the five countries, saying they were not cutting their structural deficits as deeply as agreed.

In its letter to the French finance ministry, the Commission wrote: "The preliminary evaluation of the Commission indicates that France's trajectory does not respect the rhythm of debt reduction in 2019," referring to euro zone rules. The Commission called on Paris to clarify by Oct. 22

Overall, the Commission was unhappy that the five countries were not cutting their structural deficits by up to 0.6 percent of gross domestic product (GDP), instead targeting a less ambitious 0.2 percent of economic output.

The Iran Consul General stressed oil, chemical, gas and other sectors of the economy should be concentrated upon for mutual trade between the both countries.
