Many are walking the 80 km distance from Najaf from the shrine of the Commander of the Faithful, Imam Ali (AS), towards Karbala. This is indeed the experience of a lifetime. People of all age groups, even toddlers in their strollers are accompanied by their parents.

It is the world's largest annual gathering, and despite the threats from the terrorists and their Godless masters, the number of pilgrims is increasing, in a grand display of devotion to the grandson of Prophet Muhammad (SAWA), who was tragically martyred by those shamelessly claiming to be Muslims.

Pilgrimage to the holy shrine on the Day of Arba'een is indeed a clear path towards paradise, as promised by the Prophet and testified by many a hadith.


This is the reason that among the pilgrims there are many Sunni Muslims and even Christians, Izadis, Zoroastrians, Hindus, and Sabians. Last year there was a delegation from the Pope and it is expected that this year also the Vatican would be sending a team of priests to join Iraqi Christians attending the Arba'een ceremony in Karbala.

As Arba'een is near, here we would like to share a famous hadith from the Prophet's 11th Infallible Heir, Imam Hasan al-Askari (AS): There are five signs to recognize or determine a true believer, and recitation of the special ziyarat (or salutation) for Imam Husain (AS) on the Day of Arba'een is one of these signs.

The other signs of a true believer: are recitation in raised voice of the Qur'anic ayah Bismillah-ir-Rahman-ir-Raheem during the ritual prayers; performance of 51 raka'at of ritual prayers in a single day at different times (that is, 17 obligatory and 34 recommended); prostration on soil or clay; and wearing of ring in a finger of the right hand.

The special Arba'een Ziyarah has been related on the authority of Imam Ja'far as-Sadeq (AS), the great-grandson of the Martyr of Karbala and the 6th Infallible Heir of the Prophet. It was dictated to his disciple Safwan Jammaal.
