Bozo Bolton Burns Out on Anniversary of 9/11 Lie

Iran Warns UN of New 'U.S.-Israeli Plot'

VIENNA (Dispatches) – Iran on Wednesday denounced a "U.S.-Israeli plot" to put pressure on the UN nuclear agency, after the IAEA called for more cooperation from Tehran following what was alleged as the detection of uranium particles at a site.

Reuters quoted unnamed "diplomats" as saying that the agency wanted Iran to explain how traces of uranium were allegedly found at a site that Zionist PM Benjamin Netanyahu described a year ago as a "secret atomic warehouse" at a carpet cleaning shop near Tehran, drawing ridicule from many Iranians.

"Since two days before this session of the Board, we are witnessing a U.S.-Israeli plot with the support of their affiliated media," Iran's ambassador to the IAEA, Kazem Gharibabadi, said in a statement to an IAEA Board of

Governors meeting that began on Monday.

He singled out former US National Security Adviser John Bolton, a hawk on Iran who left his job on Tuesday. On Saturday, hours before the IAEA's acting chief flew to Tehran for a visit, Bolton had said that Iran "may be concealing nuclear material and/or activities".

Netanyahu also claimed on Monday that Iran had been developing nuclear weapons at a different site that Tehran had since destroyed.

John Bolton's remark wishing to set an agenda for the visit of the Acting DG on the night that he was on his way to Tehran, along with the media campaign done by two news agencies, as well as the show played by the Israeli regime prime minister, all-in-all indicate that a joint project is underway," Gharibabadi said.

"These show-off measures are

aimed at increasing pressure on the Agency, hitting the last straw on the JCPOA," he said, referring to Iran's nuclear deal with major powers by its full name, the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action.

Washington exited the nuclear agreement last year and has reimposed sanctions on Iran. Iran has responded by announcing some steps to exceed thresholds in the agreement but says it still aims to keep the pact in place.

When asked by reporters whether traces of radioactive material had been found and why the IAEA is pushing for better cooperation, Gharibabadi said such issues are confidential and Iran is "timely and proactively cooperating" with the IAEA.

He also took a swipe at the Zionist regime, which is widely believed to possess several hundred

Center Slams U.S. Detention of Iranian Scientist

TEHRAN (Dispatches) – A leading Iranian cultural organization on Wednesday hit out at the United States for its protracted detention of an Iranian stem-cell scientist on "hollow" grounds, calling on advocates of human rights worldwide to help end the "arbitrary detention".

"The U.S. government constantly delays Dr. Soleimani's trial in violation of academic and research protocols, and has so far failed to produce any official report on the reason behind his arrest," said Iran's Supreme Council of the Cultural Revolution in a statement published on its website.

Masoud Soleimani was arrested upon his arrival in Chicago in October last year on charges that he had violated trade sanctions against Iran. He has been held in detention south of Atlanta since then.

Soleimani and two of his students, who are free on bond, are accused of conspiring to export biological materials from the U.S. to Iran without a license from the Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control.

Attorneys in the case say he seized on the plans of a former student to travel from the U.S. to Iran in September 2016 as a chance to get recombinant proteins used in his research at a lower price than what he would pay at home.

Lawyers for the scientists argue that the trio did nothing wrong, stressing that no specific license was re-

quired as the proteins are medical materials and that transporting them to Iran for noncommercial purposes does not amount to exporting goods.

The council further said Soleimani ranked among the world's top 100 scientists in terms of scientific citation, who had traveled to the U.S. at the invitation of the Minnesota-based Mayo Clinic — a ranking non-profit academic medical center — on a valid visa.

He was arrested right upon arrival without charge or trial, and was currently jailed alongside criminals, drug traffickers, and hooligans, it added.

"Dr. Soleimani's detention is a clear example of arbitrary arrest," prohibited under all international norms, added the statement.

The case serves to prove the U.S.'s adversarial and inhumane attitude given that Soleimani's research and academic background has nothing to do with Washington's sanctions targeting Iran, it stated.

"The American government, which has failed to block Iran's monumental scientific progress...has now resorted to such inhumane behavior," the document noted.

It asserted that Soleimani was an "apolitical academic figure." The detention prevented him from seeing his mother, who went into a coma after learning about his arrest, and passed away recently.

U.S. Troops Must Leave Afghanistan: Iran Envoy

UNITED NATIONS (Dispatches) -- Iran's ambassador to the United Nations has said U.S. troops must leave Afghanistan where security is non-existence after years of American invasion.

"After almost two decades of U.S. invasion of Afghanistan, it is quite clear that the U.S. has no choice, but to leave that country, and the sooner, the better," Majid Takht-Ravanchi told a meeting of the UN General Assembly on Afghanistan.

"As we have stated time and again, the time-bound and responsible withdrawal of all foreign forces is a strong national demand of the people of Afghanistan," said Takht-Ravanchi.

"The increase in attacks by Daesh is a source of grave concern and underlines the need for combating them seriously and resolutely," he said.

Certain countries, he said, help transfer Daesh elements from Syria and Iraq to Afghanistan, which has significantly boosted the combat capability of the terror group.

"Therefore those countries are also responsible for the crimes committed by Daesh," said the Iranian envoy.

Afghanistan, he said, is passing through a critical juncture and there are alarming trends in its political and security domains.

He called on all parties to help reach a national reconciliation permanent ceasefire deal. The Iranian ambassador asked Afghan parties to "exercise maximum restraint" and avoid any actions that could deteriorate the security situation in the country.

Takht-Ravanchi further highlighted the importance of the upcoming presidential election in the country.

He said numerous efforts are being made to hold a successful presidential election on September 28, but there are attempts to undermine this important event.

"Holding a free and fair presidential election can further enhance the democratic institutions of this country," said Takht-Ravanchi.

He also urged the UN and the international community to support the elections process and help hold the vote as scheduled.

"Iran also urges all Afghan parties and political groups as well as all Afghans eligible to vote to actively participate in the election as it is essential for the improvement of the security and socio-economic conditions of Afghanistan."

Qeshm, Chinese Port Sign Geoparks Cooperation Deal

TEHRAN (IFP) – The Qeshm Global Geopark in southern Iran and the Dunhuang UNESCO Global Geopark in the City of Dunhuang in China's Gansu Province have signed a sisterhood and cooperation agreement.

The development came on the sidelines of the 6th Asia Pacific Geoparks Network (APGN) Symposium recently held in Rinjani-Lombok UNESCO Global Geopark in Indonesia.

The agreement was signed by the directors of the two geoparks. The director of the Qeshm Global Geopark was the only

Iranian on the team of official assessors of UNESCO's Global Geoparks Network. He visited China in line with efforts to assess the condition of global geoparks as well as the condition of the Dunhuang geopark.

In the agreement, the two officials stressed the necessity of undertaking joint projects, working together to upgrade the quality of geoparks, and exchanging geotourists.

Accordingly, authorities of the Dunhuang UNESCO Global Geopark said they were ready to visit the Qeshm Global Geopark in early 2020 and draw on the experiences

used in the development of that park.

The Qeshm Global Geopark in southern Iran and the Dunhuang UNESCO Global Geopark in the City of Dunhuang in China's Gansu Province sign a sisterhood and cooperation agreement.

In the meeting between the directors of the two parks, the Dunhuang governor touched upon the strong political and economic relations between Tehran and Beijing as well as the many similarities between the two geoparks. He said he would welcome Qeshm Global Geopark officials in Dunhuang, and

expressed hope the two regions of Qeshm and Dunhuang will have fruitful cooperation in different areas.

The Qeshm Global Geopark and the Dunhuang UNESCO Global Geopark are similar in many ways, namely with regards to their geological and natural features as well as their potential to attract tourists and further promote the tourist industry. The conclusion of this agreement further paves the way for the transfer of know-how, experience and expertise between the two geoparks.
