How Did They Become White?

The holocaust in Gaza of Palestinians, who are proud (mostly Muslim plus a Christian minority) members of the Semitic race, by the illegal Zionist entity with the active support of the US president, "Genocidal Joe (Biden), has awakened the masses in the Americas and Europe from the deep slumber into which they had been lulled since the end of World War 2 on the myth of an imaginary massacre of Jews by Nazi Germany.

For the past five-and-a-half months, massive rallies calling for end of the Gaza genocide and establishment of independent Palestine from the banks of the River Jordan to the shores of the Mediterranean Sea are being staged almost daily in cities throughout North America and Western Europe, where conscientious people, including the real Jews (not the Zionists) have started debates on the lack of legitimacy of Israel, and whether Judaism has the concept of such a state.

How have they been classified as "whites" and how have they not just assimilated with the Europeans and the Americans of European origin, but begun to dominate them.

Thanks to such debates, researchers after extensive study of Zionism and the Zionists, are now noting the important point that the ruling clique in Israel as well as the illegal migrants to Palestine from the US and European countries, have no connection with the ancient Israelite tribes, but ethnically are of non-Semitic stock originating in Eastern Europe with a dubious claim to be converts to Judaism.

This is crystal clear if one takes a glance and studies the background of not just child-killer Benjamin Netanyahu and the rest of the Israeli politicians, generals and their supporters, but also of the Zionists who control the US Senate, the House of Representatives, and the Presidency, such as the bloodthirsty criminal Antony Blinken, who possess as Secretary of State.

The same is true of many influential politicians and wealthy bankers in European countries, including the joker Vlodymir Zelensky, who masquerades as the president of Ukraine, to actually destroy the Ukrainian people.

In view of these undeniable facts, words like anti-Semitism, Israel and the so-called holocaust of mid-20th century Europe with its alleged gas chambers (of which no traces have been discovered), are myths coined by the victors of World War 2 to hold the Muslim world as hostage as well as to distort Judaism through wanton shedding of the blood of the innocents.

Kayhan President Raisi: Government Committed to Developing Digital Economy, AI

TEHRAN - Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi here Sunday expressed his administration's support for the digital economy and the enhancement of artificial intelligence technologies.

In a meeting with the representatives of various guilds and virtual businesses, held in Tehran on Saturday evening, Raisi said his administration regards the digital economy as a great opportunity.

Highlighting the major investments in diverse sectors to trigger a boom in digital businesses, the president said his administration places great emphasis on "preserving and attracting domestic talents in the digital economy sector and making major strides in the artificial intelligence field."

Describing the "technology and innovation ecosystem" as the driving force behind development in the contemporary era, Raisi said domestic knowledge-based companies' focus on artificial intelligence and reliance on the young talented and innovative forces herald a promising future for technological advances.

Pointing to the target of an economic growth of eight percent in Iran, the president said the digital economy has a significant share in this course considering the creation of jobs, the speed of return on investment, high productivity, and reduced expenses.

He voiced the administration's financial and legal support for the private sector in the digital economy sector.

Last month, the head of Islamic World Science & Technology Monitoring and Citation Institute (ISC) said Iran has stood in the first place among the Islamic countries in terms of artificial intelligence technologies.

Minister: Iran Ready to Help Syria Enhance Deterrence

TEHRAN -- Defense Minister **Brigadier General Muhammad Reza** Ashtiani has stated that Iran is prepared to utilize its full capabilities to assist Syria in enhancing its defense and deterrent power against the U.S.

In a meeting with his Syrian counterpart Ali Mahmoud Abbas here, Ashtiani warned against plots by the United States and Israel to intensify crisis across West Asia.

"Any strategic mistake and adventure of the U.S. and the Zionist regime will lead to the worsening of the situation in the region," he

He condemned Israel's airstrikes against Syria and violation of its territorial integrity, saying the regime seeks to destroy the country's ports and hit convoys carrying fuel insecurity and displacement of mil-

against the resistance front.

The Iranian defense chief expressed confidence that Israel's attacks are rooted in the regime's fear and failures.

He stressed the importance of reinforcing deterrence in countering Israel's attacks and noted that "necessary and urgent" measures and plans are on the agenda to counter the regime's aggression.

Ashtiani emphasized that the U.S.'s "illegitimate, occupying, illegal and unjustifiable" military presence in Syria is a blatant violation of the fundamental principles of international law and the United Nations Charter.

The destructive performance of the U.S. in West Asia, particularly infrastructure such as airports and in Syria, has only led to instability,

and food under the pretext of fight lions of Syrians, he said. The Iranian defense minister

> stressed the need to boost Syria's defense capability and implement bilateral agreements in this regard, saying the two countries should hold constant consultations given the ongoing developments in the

region.

Pointing to the sensitive and complicated situation in the region, he said more than 31,000 Palestinians have been killed and over 70,000 injured during Israel's genocidal war on Gaza over the past five months.

He criticized the United Nations and Security Council for failing to fulfill their international responsibility vis-a-vis Israel's war crimes and genocide in Gaza, emphasizing that the regime will definitely fail to achieve any of its goals in the Strip.

Tel Aviv has significantly ramped up the strikes against Syria since last October, when it began the genocidal war against the Gaza Strip.

TikTok Ban Calls U.S. Bluff on Freedom of Speech

TEHRAN - Iran's Minister of Information and Communications Technology Isa Zarepour has said that the United States government is adamant to ban Chinese social media platform TikTok despite its claims to freedom of speech.

"After months of dispute, the U.S. government finally made its decision to ban or get the ownership of TikTok. In today's world, data is of key and strategic importance to countries, even more than oil," he wrote on Iranian social media application Virasty.

On March 14, the U.S. House of Representatives overwhelmingly passed a bill that calls for TikTok's Chinese owner ByteDance to divest from the company or be removed from US app stores.

The bill still needs to be approved by the Senate. But President Joe Biden has backed the bill and said that he would sign it into law if it passes Congress.

The U.S. has claimed that TikTok could allow the Chinese government to access user data, posing a national security threat. The Chinese government has vehemently rejected that claim.

TikTok is used by 170 million people in the U.S., which represents nearly half of the country's population.

Azerbaijan, Iran Move to 'Open New Chapter' in Ties

TEHRAN -- Iran's Ambassador to Azerbaijan Abbas Mousavi says Tehran and Baku have emphasized the need to "open a new chapter" in relations between the two neighbors, following efforts by the two sides to resolve misunderstandings.

Mousavi made the remarks in a post on X, after meeting with Hikmet Hajiyev, the assistant of the Azerbaijani President in the capital Tehran.

"In my recent meeting with Hikmet Hajiyev, the assistant of the Azerbaijani President, we reviewed the latest developments in the South Caucasus region and bilateral relations between Iran

and Azerbaijan," he wrote. "We emphasized the need to open a new chapter in the re-

lations between the two neighbors," the envoy added.

On Thursday, an Azerbaijani delegation traveled to Tehran to prepare for the reopening of their embassy in the Islamic Republic following diplomatic tensions over the past year.

In an interview with Baku TV, Mousavi praised the "historical background" between the two neighboring countries and stressed that they would not allow "misunderstandings" to persist and sour their ties.

He also said the activities of the Embassy of Azerbaijan in Tehran will "soon" resume while announcing that a delegation has traveled to Tehran to make the preparations.
