West Harps on Holocaust Myth While the Real Holocaust Rages in Gaza

When the illegal Zionist entity unleashed its latest round of holocaust on Gaza in continuation of its unabated 76-year long genocide of the native Semitic people of Palestine on 8th October last year, a day after the heroic Operation Al-Aqsa Storm that shattered Israel's supposed intelligence and military superiority, the US president expressed support for the carnage and said: "I am a Zionist though not a Jew."

It was one of the rare moments in his life that Joe Biden, a habitual liar and falsifier of facts who yesterday on May 7 in his national address indulged in the most preposterous lies related to World War 2 in Europe, was telling the truth.

Seven months back while shamelessly saying "I stand with Israel", he made no secret of his hatred of Palestinians, Arabs, Muslims, and all conscientious people worldwide, including Christians and the real Semitic Jews who regard the planting of usurper Israel in Palestine as violation of the basic tenets of Judaism.

Since then he has poured scores of billions of dollars of lethal weaponry, plus cash in the coffers of the bloodthirsty non-Semitic East European Zionist occupiers of Palestine to massacre so far some 35,000 civilians (mostly women and children) besides serious injury to almost 80,000 others and destruction of the infrastructure including mosques, churches, schools, and hospitals, as undeniable proof of his relish for the holocaust and hatred of the Semitic people - the majority of whom are Muslims.

Now yesterday on Tuesday, faced with the nationwide awakening of the US citizens to the holocaust in Gaza and their donning of the Arab kaffiyah along with waiving of the Palestinian flag and calls for "Freedom of Palestine from the River (Jordan) to the Sea (Mediterranean)", Biden blurted out lies after lies by harping on the alleged holocaust that never occurred in mid-20th century Europe, and tried to mislead the audience by claiming the Nazis gassed to death six million Jews, despite the fact that Jews in those days were not even half the number.

It was a clear attempt by the US regime, along with the regimes of Europe to try to distract the anger and attention of their awakened people from the real holocaust underway in Gaza by trying to blow out of proportion some minor occurrences in German-occupied Poland between 1942 and 1945 regarding punishment of a few hundred collaborators of the Allied powers.

The West is now at a complete loss. The new generations in Europe and the Americas are aware of facts. They don't want to be fooled by myths of the Nazi era.

Moreover, they question: Why should Palestine and the Palestinians suffer because of some undocumented occurrences of Adolf Hitler's era?

The fact of the matter is that, the illegitimacy and brutality of Israel has been fully exposed to the whole world, and whatever lies Biden and his bloodthirsty ilk say, the Americans and the Europeans are not going to be fooled.

They are determined to continue their campaign until Palestine is free.

Nuclear Chief: Israel's Hostile Acts Should Not Affect Iran-IAEA Ties

TEHRAN - Head of the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI) Muhammad Eslami on Tuesday said that Israel's "hostile" acts should not affect the interaction between Tehran and the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA).

Speaking during a meeting with IAEA Director General Rafael Grossi in Isfahan, Eslami warned against attempts by "ill-wishers" to devalue and paint a black picture of Iran's cooperation with the UN nuclear agency.

"Hostile measures against Iran, with a Zionist root, should be watched so as they do not affect the interaction between the two sides," he said.

"The nature of the Zionist regime has been exposed to the world... and this is the same nature that supports a destructive trend against Iran."

In March 2023, Iran and the IAEA issued a joint statement in which both sides recognized that bilateral positive engagements can pave the way for wider agreements among state parties.

They also agreed that bilateral interactions will be carried out in a

spirit of collaboration, and in full conformity with the competencies of the IAEA and the rights and obligations of Iran based on the comprehensive safeguards agreement.

Eslami hailed his "constructive" talks with Grossi and described last year's joint statement as a roadmap for cooperation between Iran and the IAEA.

He also emphasized that Iran will continue its interaction with the IAEA in three areas, saying, the first one is related to the past issues, with a focus on solving the issue of two locations.

"The second one is about the current situation and following up expectations and shortcomings within the framework of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) and the Safeguards Agreement... The responsibility for third one lies on Grossi and he should take steps for the future."

At a news conference in Isfahan later in the day, Grossi said he had proposed "very practical and tangible measures" to speed up cooperation between the IAEA and Iran.

"What we are looking at is concrete measures that could make

this operational," he said.

Eslami again stressed that the talks with the IAEA chief had been positive and productive, calling on Grossi to take "necessary actions to settle the problems that are mainly political."

"We continue interactions over unresolved issues," he added.

Over the past years, Iran has recorded many achievements in its peaceful nuclear energy program in defiance of U.S. sanctions as well as hurdles created by the West.

The country has also been closely cooperating with the IAEA as a signatory to the NPT.

Earlier on Monday, Iranian Foreign Minister Hussein Amir-Abdollahian met with Grossi and stressed the need for the UN nuclear agency to adopt impartial and professional stances and urged the IAEA should not be undermined by the U.S.' unstable and contradictory conducts.

Amir-Abdollahian said the IAEA chief's visit to Iran comes at the right time, particularly given the complicated and sensitive situation in the region.

Navy to Dispatch Research Team to Antarctic

TEHRAN - Navy Commander Rear Admiral Shahram Irani said on Tuesday that the Iranian Navy will deploy a team of researchers to the Antarctic.

During a visit to the Navy's base at Imam Khomeini port in southern Iran, Rear Admiral Irani highlighted the country's maximum deterrent power in all strategic and influential locations and hubs.

He noted that the Iranian naval forces are fully prepared to take

part in all joint war games in the Pacific and Atlantic oceans.

He also unveiled plans for the Iranian Navy to dispatch a scientific and research delegation to the Antarctic with 100 percent preparedness to conduct scientific research.

In January, the senior commander unveiled plans for Iran's naval presence in the Antarctic.

The Iranian Navy's 86th flotilla, comprising the Dena destroyer and the Makran forward base ship, left

Iran's southern port city of Bandar Abbas in September 2022 and returned home in May 2023 after sailing 63,000 kilometers of sea routes.

The Navy said many foreign countries have become interested in purchasing Iran's homegrown Dena destroyer, which circumnavigated the world as part of the 86th flotilla without any breakdown or even a mere fracture in its antennas.

Tehran Court Urges France to Repatriate MKO Terrorists

TEHRAN - An Iranian court has called on France to repatriate the members of the terrorist group Mujahedin-e Khalq Organization (MKO).

During the second hearing of the new round of legal proceedings against the MKO members in Tehran, Judge Dehghani emphasized on Tuesday that hosting MKO members constitutes a crime according to international conventions combating terrorism. He urged certain countries, including France, to coop-

erate with international organizations in prosecuting the defendants.

Judge Dehghani also advised countries to reconsider hosting individuals who have committed criminal acts against humanity.

He advised the people of Albania that hosts members of the terrorist group to demand the extradition of the terrorists from their respective country.

Some 104 members of the terrorist group as well as a legal entity (the MKO) are being

sued in the trial for committing inhumane crimes.

The MKO has carried out numerous terrorist attacks in Iran against ordinary people and officials since the Islamic Revolution in 1979, resulting in the deaths of thousands of people over the past four decades.

Iranian Judiciary spokesperson Masoud Setayeshi has stated that the MKO has been responsible for over 100 acts of terrorism and betrayal against the Iranian nation.

IRGC Chief: Iran Widening Battlefield to Break Up Enemy

TEHRAN - The chief commander of Iran's Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) Major General Hussein Salami said on Tuesday that Islamic territories must close ranks as a united front against the common arrogant adversaries, describing the expansion of the battlefield as a strategy for disintegration of the enemy.

"The U.S. has targeted the entire Islamic world... it seeks to dominate all Muslims, hijack their cultural identities and seize their wealth. All Muslims are, therefore, in the same boat. If the enemy manages to infiltrate into a Muslim state, it will go on with others. Therefore, the path for aggressors to [advance their] dominance must be blocked," Major General Salami said.

He was addressing a ceremony in the capital Tehran in commemoration of the IRGC advisors assassinated in an Israeli attack against the Iranian consulate in Syria on April 1.

Salami added that the IRGC Quds Force has stopped the enemy in the eastern parts of the Mediterranean Sea, and is expanding the front so that enemies will fall apart.

By doing so, he said, "We are protecting our own country's national security and also the security and dignity of other Muslims."

"Muslim lands should be a battlefield against aggressors, because we face a common enemy, have a common destiny and share causes. We cannot live apart from each other," Salami said.

The IRGC chief commander further noted that enemies are nearing their end, stressing that Operation Al-Aqsa Storm pushed Israel to the verge of "brain death," exposed its vulnerability and demonstrated the fact that the Tel Aviv regime is so shaky.

"The most abhorrent regimes on earth are Israel and the US, which supports it. Through U.S. military and political support and on the West artificial respiration, it (Israel) has been able to extend its existence which is coming to an end," Salami pointed out.
