Ottawa Regime's Bleak, Black, Bloody Human Rights Record

No amount of snowfall or the sheets of ice that blanket Canada in autumn and winter can whitewash the blood stains from the hands of a regime which relishes the organized murder of native children and their burial in secret mass graves.

Yet Ottawa claims to be an advocate of human rights and tries to meddle in the affairs of independent countries, such as Iran, by shamelessly supporting criminals of all hue and colour, including embezzlers, murderers, traitors, and blasphemers.

In violation of international rules, the regime of the preposterous liar, Justin Trudeau, who makes a mockery of himself by blowing out of proportion the figure of 15 convicts found deserving of capital punishment to "15,000 already executed", refuses to handover to Iran at least 9 embezzlers who stole billions of US dollars of public money.

The most wanted Iranian fugitives from justice are Mohammed Reza Khavari and Marjan Sheikholeslami Alegha, whose extradition Canada has ignored despite the petitions of citizens of Iranian origin against turning their adopted country into a safe haven for notorious convicts.

Tehran views as no more than trash the biased statements that Ottawa issues against the Islamic Republic and its adoption of a hostile posture at the UN regarding events in Iran, while startling evidence of the systematic ethnic massacres of Canada's racist regime is unearthed.

A native group in western Canada recently discovered evidence of unmarked graves and a piece of a child's jawbone in the premises of a former residential school, shining a light on generations of oppression against them.

According to the Star Blanket Cree Community, an indigenous group, ground-penetrating radar in the province of Saskatchewan helped locate as many as 2,000 areas of possible unmarked graves.

It called for thorough investigation, describing the jawbone fragment as the "physical proof of an unmarked grave", but given the cowardly and callous nature of Trudeau regime, there is little chance of the thorough probe of these areas.

Canadian authorities have been forcibly separating thousands of indigenous children from their families for more than 100 years and making them attend the so-called residential schools, in order to sever their cultural ties and assimilate them into the Christian community.

The bleak, black and bloody record of Canada speaks for itself, especially in view of concrete evidence found of the forcible removal from their families of over 150,000 natives or First Nations children and their sending to the so-called residential schools, which are rife with physical abuse, rape, malnutrition, and other atrocities against the children.

Since 2021, at least 1,300 child graves were unearthed near government-run compulsory boarding schools for indigenous children.

These are not the sole crimes against humanity of the idiotic Trudeau and his predecessor regimes.

To Canada's flawed climate policy, its violation of the rights of immigrants, its granting of asylum to embezzlers, and its support for terrorists, traitors, secessionists, seditionists, blasphemers, murderers, and characterless women, should be added the deprivation of the native population centres of healthy drinking water.

No wonder, the Ottawa regime impudently indulges in the ethnic cleansing of the original inhabitants of the land Canada and no feels no inhibitions in vain efforts to cause socio-economic damage to independent world countries, especially the Islamic Republic of Iran.

Raisi Calls for Measures to Ensure Medicine Supply

TEHRAN – President Ebrahim Raisi on Monday called for detailed plans to ensure a sustainable supply of pharmaceutical products and prevent seasonal shortages in the country.

In comments at a meeting of the Administration's Economic Coordination Headquarters here, Raisi called on the health ministry and other responsible organizations to formulate detailed plans to meet medical needs and avert chronic shortages of pharmaceutical products.

The president also stressed the need to reduce the costs of treatment and allocate governmental subsidies to medicine.

The minister of health announced in the meeting that the shortage of a limited number of medicines that occurred in early autumn has been eased with the help of domestic producers and importers, stating that the reserves of medicines in Iran are

in a suitable state.

In December 2022, Raisi said Iran's capacity to produce 95 percent of its needed medicines domestically could turn the country into the region's hub of pharmaceuticals.

The president's call may provinces across Iran are grappling with a sharp drop in temperatures and winter storms.

The Center for Management of Natural Disasters said Monday the cold spell has affected large swathes of the country and many provinces have experienced temperatures of down to -29 degrees centigrade that is unprecedented in the past 14 years.

The director of the center said temperatures are now below the freezing points in 27 out of the 31 provinces of Iran and this has caused problems amid low natural gas supplies to certain parts of the country.

Ali Torkian said thanks to the lower consumption across the country that followed related calls by government and local officials, the shortage in the supply is being addressed.

Torkian said the interior minister and provincial governors had decided in an urgent meeting held Monday that the National Iranian Gas Company should immediately tackle the problem of low gas pressure in the eastern and northeastern provinces, which have borne the brunt of the cold snap, especially where supply to residential homes has been cut off over the past 24 hours.

The shortage has been attributed to a suspension in gas swap between Iran and Turkmenistan.

He said officials have been working hard to solve the problem of short supply and have held over 200 crisis management meetings and meetings of the energy working group over the past week.

Drones Have Given Iran Asymmetric Advantage

WASHINGTON (Dispatches) -- On January 6, the Treasury Department imposed sanctions on the executive board members of the Qods Aviation and Aerospace Industries Organization (IAIO), an Iranian defense company founded by the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) in 1985.

IAIO designs and manufactures Mohajer-6 mid-range reconnaissance and combat drones. It has been sanctioned by the Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) since December 2013.

The U.S. government may also increase sanctions against officials of the Iran Aircraft Manufacturing Industries Corporation (HESA), which produces the Shahed-136 suicide drone. Like IAIO, HESA has been sanctioned by the United States, the European Union, and the United Kingdom for over a decade.

For years, the United States has imposed sanctions against Iran's military-industrial complex and manufacturing base, including entities like IAIO, HESA, Fajr Aviation Composite Industries (FACI),

Iran Helicopter Support and Renewal Industries (PAHNA), and Iran Aircraft Industries (IACI), to name a few.

"Nevertheless, Iran's aerospace sector and drone industry have continued to expand and thrive. Western sanctions have been unable to prevent Iran from becoming a prominent player in the military drone market and sharing drone technology with partners and proxies inside and outside of the Middle East," leading U.S. magazine National Interest wrote.

Senior Resistance Member:

Hezbollah Can Tackle Zionists Thanks to Gen. Soleimani

TEHRAN -- Iran's anti-terror commander General Qassem Soleimani was behind the idea of surrounding the occupying regime of Israeli with missiles, and he succeeded in finalizing and implementing his plan, says a senior member of the Lebanese resistance movement Hezbollah.

Mahmoud Qamati, a member of the Political Council of Hezbollah, said if the Lebanese resistance movement is ready to go to war with the Zionist regime and relies on its own missiles and drones, it is because of the great efforts made by General Soleimani.

"Martyr Soleimani's idea was to encircle Israel, and he man-

aged to do so in practice. It was Martyr Soleimani who made plans for the missiles of Lebanon and Gaza, as well as Iraq and even Yemen," Iran's Tasnim news agency quoted Qamati as saying.

General Soleimani, the commander of the Quds Force of Iran's Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC), was assassinated in a U.S. drone strike authorized by former US president Donald Trump near Baghdad airport on January 3, 2020.

He is praised in the region as the champion in the fight against terrorist groups, particularly Daesh, which has been supported by the United States and the Zionist regime.

Highlighting the world-renowned general's endeavors, Qamati said the Lebanese resistance movement, as part of the broader Axis of Resistance in the region, was founded by General Soleimani.

He said General Soleimani managed to transform the resistance in all aspects due to his "pioneering spirit" and "strategic outlook."

"He was among us in resistance operation rooms since the 2006 war," Qamati recalled, adding that General Soleimani began to help with the reconstruction of Lebanon immediately after the war.

MP: UK Angry Over Intelligence Debacle

TEHRAN – An Iranian lawmaker said Monday the United Kingdom fumes over intelligence failure after a senior official, Alireza Akbari, was executed for spying for the British intelligence agency.

"The UK is not upset about Akbari's execution. Britain always has victims achieve its espionage goals, but it is now angry about the intelligence failure," Ebrahim Azizi, deputy chairman of the National Security and Foreign Policy Committee, said.

He explained that Akbari had acted against a nation and imperiled precious defense and security intelligence.

"Spy elements are all treated harshly across the world and this is an internationally recognized fact," Azizi added.

He said the British are upset because they have found out that they were making decisions based on wrong information fed to them by Iran's intelligence services all along.

"They invested on someone for years, and now they have realized that Iranian intelligence services kept close watch on him, and that has infuriated them," he added.

The lawmaker said it is unnecessary to respond to the "baseless, unfounded, and irrational" statements with no national and international legal basis about Akbari's execution, he concluded.

Akbari was arrested in 2019. He had received 1,805,000 euros, 265,000 pounds, and \$50,000 for espionage activities for the United Kingdom.

Iran's judiciary said the convict, who had been sentenced to death on charges of "corruption on earth" and "extensive activities against the country's internal and external security" through espionage for the British government's spy agency, was hanged on Saturday.

In a statement on Wednesday, Iran's intelligence ministry described Akbari as "one of the most infiltrating agents of the spying service of the evil UK in the country's sensitive and strategic centers," noting that he was identified and arrested after a "long and multi-layered process" involving "counter-intelligence" and "deception operation."
