Imam Hadi (AS) was only 42 years old when martyred, and was succeeded his son Imam Hasan al-Askari (AS).

Well friends, Monday as you all know was first day of the blessed month of Rajab, the first of the four sacred months. The first day happens to be a very blessed occasion. It is the birthday of the Splitter and Spreader of Sciences, or to be more precise, Imam Muhammad al-Baqer al-Uloum (AS), the 5th Infallible Heir of Prophet Muhammad (SAWA).
