Outrage as Gaza Children's Artwork **Removed From London Hospital**

LONDON (MEMO) - A London hospital was compelled to take down a display of artwork created by Palestinian schoolchildren- from Gaza- after complaints raised by UK Lawyers for the Zionist regime on behalf of "vulnerable" patients, reports Alarabinuk.

A display of decorated plates, along with illustrations of their significance, was reportedly designed by kids at two UNWRA schools in Gaza. Chelsea & Westminster Community Hospital school children painted the designs on the plates and displayed them in the "Crossing Borders – a Festival of Plates" exhibit by the outpatient department entrance. The caption for one of the display plates was: "The olive branch is the symbol of peace and is used to express the wish for an independent Palestinian state."

UK Lawyers For Israel (UK-LFI), which filed a complaint with the hospital regarding the exhibition, claimed that the young

students at the two schools involved; Beit Lahia Girls' School and Jabalia Prep Boys' School, had been taught with Hamas ideology embedded within their cur-

The display in the lobby of Chelsea and Westminster Hospital left some patients feeling "vulnerable, offended and harassed," according to UKLFI. A hospital spokesperson stated, "I can confirm that these pictures have been taken down. We appreciate you bringing this to our attention".

Anas Altikriti, CEO of The Cordoba Foundation commented that the whole story from start to finish exhibited an unhealthy state of mind within all parties concerned. The fact that adults could find a piece of artwork done by children intimidating, that an outfit such as the UKLFI could move to issue a complaint, and finally for the hospital to actually remove the artwork, is utterly bizarre.

Individuals who criticized the hospital's actions and the UKLFI for promoting the removal of the artwork tweeted that "this is just insensitive." As people appear to be more concerned with the "vulnerability complaints described feeling on walking past the artwork, where is the insight and empathy for the kids who experience this on a daily basis in Gaza."

One Twitter account shared images of the display at the hospital and stated, "If you feel vulnerable and victimized having to look at a display of artwork by children from Gaza, imagine how those children feel when an Israel soldier is pointing a gun at them."

The occupying regime of Israel frequently launches airstrikes on Syria, mostly using the airspace of Lebanon or the occupied Golan heights. The Zionist regime mostly keeps quiet about its attacks on the Syrian territories, which many view as a knee-jerk reaction to the Syrian government's increasing success in confronting terrorism.

It usually targets military positions, especially those of the Lebanese Hezbollah resistance movement, which has played a key role in helping the Syrian army in its fight against foreign-backed terrorists.

The Tel Aviv regime has been a main supporter of terrorist groups that have battled the government of President Bashar al-Assad since foreign-backed militancy erupted in Syria in early 2011.

Syria has repeatedly complained to the UN over Israeli assaults, urging the Security Council to take action against Tel Aviv's crimes. The calls have, however, fallen on deaf ears.

The latest Israeli airstrike came early on Sunday, claiming the lives of five people and injuring 15 others. According to the Syrian army, the attack was launched from the occupied Golan Heights and targeted several military sites in Damascus, including the southwestern residential neighborhood

of Kafar Sousah. The statement said Syrian air defense units intercepted most missiles before reaching the targets. Following the attack, Syria urged the United Nations to take necessary measures to deter the Zionist regime's attacks and hold it accountable for the crime.

Trade Resumes as Pakistan, Afghanistan **Reopen Torkham Border**

PESHAWAR (AP) - The normal trade and movement of people between Pakistan and Afghanistan fully resumed on Saturday after the two sides reopened a key border crossing that was shut nearly a week ago by Afghanistan's Taliban rulers, stranding people and thousands of trucks carrying food and

The Afghan embassy in Pakistan's capital, Islamabad, announced the reopening of the Torkham border on Saturday on Twitter. Pakistani officials and Afghanistan's Taliban-appointed administrator in Afghanistan's Nangarhar province also confirmed that the border crossing is open to passengers and trade.

The announcement sparked a wave of joy among those who had been waiting for the reopening of the international trade route since Sunday, when Afghanistan's Taliban rulers closed the crossing. The Taliban had claimed Islamabad was not abiding by an agreement with Kabul to allow sick Afghan patients and their caretakers to cross into Pakistan without travel documents for medical care.

Last Monday, Afghan Taliban forces and Pakistani border guards exchanged fire, wounding a Pakistani soldier. Since then, officials from the two sides were in talks to resolve the issue amid demands from people on both sides to immediately reopen the cross-

On Wednesday, Pakistan's defense minister, Khawaja Mohammad Asif, and secret service chief, Lt. Gen. Anjum Nadeem, traveled to Kabul on an unannounced but previously scheduled visit and met senior Taliban officials to discuss the closure and other is-

After the visit, the crossing was briefly reopened by the Afghan Taliban to allow some of the thousands of trucks that had lined up for days at the border many with vegetables, fruits and other perishable food items — to cross over and ease the backlog. But Pakistan shut the border on Thursday, saying it needed an

explanation from the Afghan side about the abrupt closure of the border on Sunday.

Pakistani and Taliban officials on Friday held talks and finally agreed to reopen the border.

On Saturday, Ziaul Haq Sarhadi, a director of the Pakistan-Afghanistan joint Chamber of Commerce and Industry, said "we are happy to confirm that Torkham is fully open for trade and movement of people." He said jubilant Afghan and Pakistani truck drivers were crossing the key trade route with

The Torkham border crossing is a vital commercial artery and a trade route to Central Asian countries for Pakistan.

Following the U.S., European countries have taken a hostile stance on Iran's defensive missile and peaceful nuclear energy programs. The EU has also challenged Tehran's regional influence, and has cooperated with Washington's illegal anti-Iran sanctions.

Last month, the European Parliament adopted an amendment calling on the European Union and its member states to include the IRGC on their "terror list".

EU foreign policy chief Josep Borrell and Germany later admitted that there were no legal grounds for taking the move.

The 27-nation bloc has also been slapping more sanctions of its own on Iran over what it calls the country's approach towards foreignbacked riots that erupted in some Iranian cities in September.

In his remarks, Gen. Hajizadeh cautioned that "the United States" benefit lies in creating regional insecurity."

He said "the region sits on a security fault line," citing the history of four decades of conflicts.

"If we fail to be strong, the enemy will bring the war inside Iran," he said. "We should be very careful in order to be able to meet the security needs of our dear nation and country."

The commander, however, hailed that the IRGC, saying the force has brought all U.S. military bases in the region within the range of its defensive firepower.

Washington's bases in the region "have turned into the Americans' weak point," he said, adding the IRGC can strike the U.S. outposts whenever the need arises.

Gen. Hajizadeh unveiled a new cruise missile, named Paveh, with a range of 1,650 km. The hypersonic missile can travel at Mach 12-13 and is capable of exoatmospheric maneuvering.

The projectile, he said, is outfitted with an engine that starts within 500 kilometers (310 miles) or a shorter distance of the target's location to enable its maneuver-

The projectile cannot be destroyed by any of the enemy's antimissile systems, he said.

"I express confidently that the enemies will not be capable of developing a similar missile over many upcoming decades.'

He said Iran has managed to reduce the weight of its long-range missiles to one-fourth and the time needed for their preparation to a

Among the immortal legacies of the 4th Imam is the "Risalat al-Hoqouq" or Treatise of Rights that is more perfect than the United Nations Charter of Human Rights, and the "Sahifat as-Sajjadiyya", which is a manual of highly eloquent supplications to God that contain every topic under the sun, including scientific issues and the weight of light – which modern science is still beginning

A study of the supplications of Imam Zayn al-Abedin (AS) show that he used them as means to educate people about the Oneness of Allah, the angels and all Islamic concepts pertaining to various fields of life. It is a pity these supplications have not been studied thoroughly even by the followers of Ahl al-Bayt, or in the academic institutions dealing with Islam. We hope that groundbreaking research will take place in this regard, especially in the seminaries and universities.

Here are some excerpts from the "Risalat-al-Hogoug":

"The greatest right upon you is from Allah Himself and this is the root of all other rights The greatest right of Allah upon you is to worship Him without associating anything with Him. If you do that with purity of heart, He promises to give you sufficiently what you need here and in the next world ... ' 'The rights of your teacher upon you are: You should look at him with honour, listen to him with full attention, sit facing him with respect and do not raise your voice in his presence. If someone asks him a question, you should not reply it but let the teacher do it... You should overlook his shortcomings and speak of his good qualities. Keep away from his enemies and do not make enemies of his friends. If you do all these, angels will be your witness that you did what you were required to do and that you obtained knowledge from him for the pleasure of Allah only."

"The rights of your mother are: she carried you where no one carries anyone else; she fed you the fruit of her heart which no one gives to anyone else; she protected you with all parts of her body. She did not care if she remained hungry as long as you were fed; if she was thirsty as long as you drank; if she had no proper clothes as long you had clothes on, if she was in the sun so long as you were in shade. She lost her sleep for you, she protected you from cold and heat so that you should live. You will never be able to thank her unless if Allah helps you.

"The right of your neighbour is that you should guard him (his belongings) in his absence, show respect to him in his presence and help him when he is wronged. Do not do any shameful act to him. If you know of any improper things about him keep that secret. If you know he will accept your advice then give it to him. Do not leave him alone when he is in trouble. Help him out of his troubles, forgive him if he has wronged you and treat him generously.
