Jessica Alba, Darren Aronofsky and Daryl Hannah are

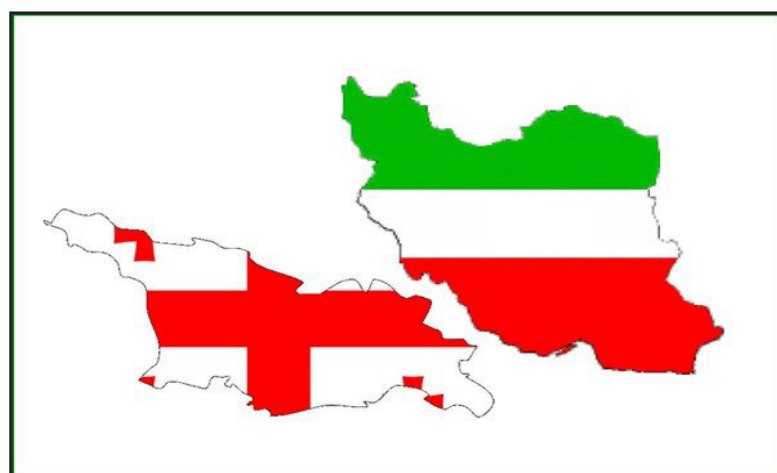
among jurors for the 2022 Human/Nature Prize, a new award this year going "to the project that best illuminates the pressing environmental issues of our time."

Tehran, Tbilisi to Broaden Ties in ICT Field



TEHRAN (MNA) - Islamic Republic of Iran and Republic of Georgia emphasized the need for enhancing cooperation in the field of Communications and Information Technology (ICT).

Iranian Deputy Minister of ICT Mohammad Khansari met with the Deputy Minister of Digital Economy, Innovation and Development of Georgia on Wednesday evening on the sidelines of World Summit on Information Society (WSIS).

10mn Year Old Fossil Discovered in Iran

TEHRAN (IFP) -- A deer footprint fossil dating back some 10 million years has been discovered in western Iran.

The fossil was spotted in one of the towns of Zanjan Province and taken to the provincial natural history museum, says the head of the Environment Department of the city of Zanjan, the provincial capital.

"In addition to the deer footprint, the fossil also contains the footprints of herbivores and carnivores," says the head of the department.

The official underlined that



not much information is available about the fossils at the mo-

ment.

"The discovered rocks will

be joined and organized in the coming days to be ready for the public to visit," he says.

The authority notes that the fossils are likely to have been damaged as the location where they were found were well traveled.

"In order to preserve and prevent damage to the fossils found, they were taken to the natural history museum where they can be kept in right conditions," he explains.

The fossils, he says, show the location used to be a habitat for deer.

Drinking Coffee Associated With Reduced Risk of Kidney Injury

WASHINGTON (Dispatches) -- A new study has revealed that consuming at least one cup of coffee a day may reduce the risk of acute kidney injury (AKI) when compared to those who do not drink coffee.

Johns Hopkins Medicine Scientists have found that those who drank any quantity of coffee every day had a 15% lower risk of AKI, with the largest reductions observed in the group that drank two to three cups a day (a 22%-23% lower risk).

They used data from the Atherosclerosis Risk in Communities Study, an ongoing survey of cardiovascular disease in four U.S. communities, researchers assessed 14,207 adults recruited between 1987 and 1989 with a median age of 54. Participants were surveyed seven times over a 24-year period as to the number of 8-ounce cups of coffee they consumed per day: zero, one, two to three, or more than three. During the survey period, there were 1,694 cases of acute kidney injury recorded.

AKI, as described by the National Kidney Foundation, is a sudden episode of kidney failure or kidney damage that happens within a few hours or a few days. This causes waste products to build up in the blood, making it hard for kidneys to maintain the correct balance of fluids in the body.
