Khachanov Stuns Kyrgios, Garcia Tops Gauff at U.S. Open

NEW YORK (Reuters) - Russia's Karen Khachanov has reached his first Grand Slam semifinal after a hard-fought win over Nick Kyrgios, edging the Australian firebrand 7-5, 4-6, 7-5, 6-7(3), 6-4 at the U.S. Open.

Wimbledon runner-up Kyrgios, who had defeated top seed Daniil Medvedev in the last round, could not maintain his mojo in an intense quarterfinal which lasted more than three and an half hours.

"It's just devastating. It's heartbreaking," said 27-year-old Kyrgios, who smashed his rackets during the match to vent his anger and frustration at some soclose-vet-so-far results.

"I feel the pain for him,"



said Khachanov. "I was prepared. I was expecting that the crowd would be more for him, that he was the favorite in their eyes."

Khachanov will face No.5 seed

Casper Ruud, as the Norwegian notched a 6-1, 6-4, 7-6 (4) victory over Italian Matteo Berrettini in the quarterfinal on Friday for a berth in the championship match.

Earlier in the day, 28-year-old Caroline Garcia of France took charge and played high-stakes tennis in the women's singles, eliminating 18-year-old American Coco Gauff 6-3, 6-4 to reach the first Grand Slam semifinal of her career.

The 17th-seeded Frenchwoman who stretched her winning streak to 13 matches will face Wimbledon runner-up Ons Jabeur.

Fifth seed Jabeur of Tunisia became the first African woman to make a US Open semifinal in the professional era. She claimed a 6-4, 7-6 (4) victory over Australia's Ajla Tomljanovic, who had ousted Serena Williams in the previous round.

Chelsea Sack Coach Tuchel Following Champions League Defeat

LONDON (AFP) - Chelsea on Wednesday sacked manager Thomas Tuchel just seven games into the season following a chastening 1-0 Champions League defeat at Dinamo Zagreb.

The London club said in a statement they had "parted company" with the German, who led them to Champions League glory in 2021 and the Club World Cup crown earlier this year.

"On behalf of everyone at Chelsea FC, the club would like to place on record its gratitude to Thomas and his staff for all their efforts during their time with the club," Chelsea said in a statement.

"Thomas will rightly have a place in Chelsea's history after winning the Champions League, the Super Cup and Club World Cup in his time here."

The Stamford Bridge club, under new owners Todd Boehly and Behdad Eghbali said they had made the change at the "right time".

Chelsea are sixth in the Premier League table after three wins, one draw and two defeats in their opening six matches.

Tuchel is the second Premier League manager to be fired this season -- Bournemouth sacking Scott Parker last week.

Nadal Hints at Extended Break After U.S. Open Exit

NEW YORK (Reuters) – Rafa Nadal said he needed to "fix things" and was unsure about his return to competitive tennis after his bid for a men's recordextending 23rd Grand Slam title ended in the fourth round of the U.S. Open on

American Frances Tiafoe, who had lost both previous meetings against the 36-year-old left-hander, stunned the second seed in front of a packed Arthur Ashe Stadium.

It was Nadal's first tournament at Flushing Meadows since he lifted his fourth U.S. Open title in 2019 and he arrived for the hardcourt major without much match practice and doubts hanging over his fitness.

"I need to go back," Nadal said, crediting his 24-year-old opponent for being the better player on the day.

"I need to fix things, life, then I don't know when I (am) going to come back. I (am) going to try to be ready mentally. When I feel that I will be ready to compete again, I will be there."

Nadal, who is expecting his first child with wife Mery Perello later this year, is scheduled to turn out for Team Europe during the Sept 23-25 Laver Cup in London alongside his great rivals Roger Federer, Novak Djokovic and Andy Murray.

The Mallorcan added the Australian Open and the French Open to his tally of major titles in 2022 but the season has also been blighted by a spate of Nadal arrived in Melbourne having

not played a competitive match for five months but then went on a 20-match winning spree, a run that included the Australian Open victory. He captured a record-extending 14th

French Open title, playing with a painkilling injection before every match to deal with a chronic foot injury.

Nadal's run at Wimbledon ended when he was forced to pull out before a semi-final clash against Australian Nick Kyrgios after suffering an abdominal injury.

Seven-time Grand Slam champion Mats Wilander said it was a "miracle" that Nadal won two majors during the

Neymar Set for Brazil Playmaker Role at World Cup

RIO DE JANEIRO (Reuters) -Neymar will be deployed in an attacking playmaking role for Brazil at this year's World Cup as the five-time world champions seek to capitalize on his scintillating form for Paris Saint-Germain.

The 30-year-old has scored nine goals and provided seven assists in eight games across all competitions for PSG this season as he relishes the freedom of a No. 10 role behind Kylian Mbappe.

And while it is a position to which he has grown accustomed since his 2017 move to PSG from Barcelona, Neymar has until now continued to play as a left-sided winger for Brazil, as he did during his four seasons at the Camp Nou.

"Neymar's creative capacity is impressive," Tite said in an interview broadcast on Brazilian television on Tuesday. "When he's at his best physical and technical level, he's sharp, he has very



quick perceptions and he's able to elude tackles.'

Brazil have been drawn in the same group as Serbia, Switzerland and Cameroon for the World Cup, to be played in Qatar from November 20 to December 18.
