Divine Wisdom of the 40-Day Period

"Indeed the earth laments over the death of a true believer for a period of 40 days." (Prophet

The Seal of Messengers never says anything by himself, and whatever he speaks are Divinelyinspired words, as testified by the Holy Qur'an in the opening Ayahs of Surah Najm

So, if the earth mourns for forty days for an ordinary believer, then how about the lamentation for the Prophet's younger grandson and his 3rd Infallible Heir, Imam Husain (AS), who refusing to pay allegiance to a tyrant, courted immortal martyrdom on the battlefield, along his dear and near ones, including sons, brothers, nephews and male companions, in order to keep alive Islam and all

The answer is provided by the Martyr of Karbala's grandson, Imam Muhammad Baqer (AS), who as a 4-year boy was present in Karbala on the bloodcurdling day of Ashura (10th Muharram 61 AH). Those still in doubt regarding the wordings of the Final and Universal Revelation of God for all mankind (the Holy Qur'an) are advised to browse through the Old Testament, where despite the havoc of interpolation over the past three millenniums, it seems certain facts still remain

"Then Moses entered the cloud as he went on up the mountain. And he stayed on the mountain forty days and forty nights." (Exodus 24:18)

Your devotees, to whatever creed they belong, are proud to pay homage to you at your Holy Shrine in what could be called the largest assembly on Planet Earth.

The Day of Arba'een thus refreshes our grief, and renews our aspirations for peace, security, moral virtues and justice when we travel to Karbala, or with faces turned towards this holy city in Iraq, we recite the famous Ziyarah for this day, which is one of the five signs of a true believer. Here is a passage from it.

"And I bear witness that you kept your promise made with Allah, and strived in His way until what was certain came upon you, so curse of Allah be on those who killed you, and curse of Allah be on those who oppressed you, and curse of Allah be on the people who came to know of it and approved

Iran, Uzbekistan Sign 17 MoUs

President Raisi in Samarkand to Attend SCO Summit

SAMARKAND (Dispatches) --Iran and Uzbekistan on Wednesday signed a total of 17 memoranda of understanding (MoUs) as the two countries seek to expand bilateral

The documents were signed in a ceremony attended by Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi, his Uzbek counterpart Shavkat Mirziyoyev and their accompanying delegations of ministers and government officials in the Uzbek city of Samarkand.

Iran's official IRNA news agency said the MoUs would allow Iran

and Uzbekistan to boost their cooperation in the fields of trade, cargo transit, cultural exchanges, health and customs issues, among others.

Raisi's website said in a report that Iranian president had hailed the signing of the documents as a major step toward the expansion of economic and trade ties between Iran and Uzbekistan.

He said the two countries can easily increase the size of their bilateral trade by three to four times from a current annual figure of around \$500 million.

The Iranian president has traveled

to Samarkand to attend a key summit of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO).

Iran applied for SCO memberships last year during the bloc's summit in Tajikistan. Reports have said that Raisi will sign a binding document of the SCO membership during the Samarkand summit planned for September 15-16.

The move will pave the way for Iran's full membership in the eightmember bloc, which include Russia and China, in April next year.

During his meeting with Mirzivovev on Wednesday, Raisi appre-

ciated Uzbekistan's endorsement of Iran's SCO membership bid.

The Shanghai Cooperation Organization -- made up of China Russia, India, Pakistan and four ex-Soviet Central Asian countries -- was set up in 2001 as a political economic and security organization to rival Western institutions.

The summit set for Thursday and Friday in the Uzbek city is the first entirely face-to-face leaders' meeting since the start of the coronavirus pandemic.

"One of the important acts of this summit will be the finalization of SCO (membership) documents and the legal process they will need to take in order to be signed by the foreign ministers of the member countries," Raisi said in Tehran before heading to Samarkand.

Iran, one of four SCO observer states, had applied for full membership in 2008 but its bid was slowed by UN and U.S. sanctions.

At a conference in Dushanbe in September last year, members of the bloc endorsed Iran's future membership.

Tehran wants to "make the most of the economic power and the capacities of the region and of Asian countries for the benefit of the Iranian nation", Raisi said.

The Kremlin said Tuesday that this week's summit in Samarkand will showcase an "alternative" to the West

Argentina Releases Iranian in Blow to U.S. Machinations

BUENOS AIRES (Dispatches) --Argentine authorities say they have allowed 12 crew members of a Venezuelan plane detained in June at the request of the U.S. to leave.

An appeals court ruled that 11 Venezuelans and one Iranian travelling on board the plane held at Ezeiza airport can depart.

Authorities also called on the judge to conclude investigation into the remaining seven crew within 10 days, local media reports

He was ordered to speed up and conclude "all pending proceedings, the definition of the procedural situation and the restrictions imposed on people and things", local daily Perfil reported.

Four Iranians and three Venezuelans will remain prohibited from leaving the country for further investigation of their case, it added.

One of the Iranians prevented from leaving is pilot Gholamreza Ghasemi who had to land his Boeing 747 cargo plane in Argentina

fully attempting to enter Uruguay.

Both Venezuela and Iran, which signed a 20-year cooperation accord in June, are under draconian U.S. sanctions.

Washington says the sale of the plane to Emtrasur, a subsidiary of Venezuelan state carrier Conviasa, in October 2021 violated U.S. sanctions.

Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro has accused the U.S. of trying "to steal from us a gigantic, modern cargo airplane"

Iran has expertise in flying Boeing 747s because it has a number of them that date from the pre-Revolution era. These older planes are still flying and Iranian pilots have some unique expertise in keeping them aloft and extending their abilities.

The Iranian pilot's son, Hussein Ghasemi, recently said that his father had flown with many airlines in the past, including to Dubai, Damascus, Paris and other cities.

Since the sale the plane, his father had been assigned by the Iranian Civil Aviation Organization to train Venezuelan pilots.
