## West's Wishful Bid to Overthrow the Islamic Republic

While the Iranian nation continues to stage multi-million-strong rallies of hijab-clad women and dedicated men reaffirming loyalty to the Islamic Republic and its pious/patriotic leadership, with calls for punishment of the thugs, traitors, and terrorists, who blasphemed Islamic sanctities; trampled national emblems; looted shops; torched banks, private cars and public buses; knifed and shot to death policemen and passersby; its frustrated arch-enemies – the US, Britain, and the illegal Zionist entity – lamenting their failure have unleashed goons on Iranian missions abroad.

The latest crime of these fugitives from justice was Saturday's violation of the diplomatic immunity of the Iranian embassy in London (right under the eyes of the motionless Bobbies) and desecration of the Islamic Republic's tricolor flag which is emblazoned in its centre with the Almighty Creator's Hallowed Name "Allah" flanked above and underneath (11 times each) by the sacred inscription "Allah-o Akbar" (God is Greatest).

Such a sacrilege is not the work of a Muslim, neither of an Iranian, nor of a human being, and yet these beasts are allowed to hurl at the staff of the Islamic Republic's mission the most blasphemous expletives that shock civilized people.

This is all being done with the connivance of the British regime which is openly supporting arson, terrorism, and spate of murders in Iran, as part of its old and worn out colonial policy – now in league with the US – to undermine the Islamic Republic and if possible to overthrow it.

London – or for that matter, Washington, Paris, Berlin and other western capitals – very well knows that the Iranian people are staunchly Islamic, strongly nationalist, fiercely independent, politically prudent, industrially energetic, and culturally aesthetic to allow the enemies to manipulate their country.

This has been proven time and again over the past four decades in the face of the most intricate plots to impede their freedom and progress, including wars, coups, sanctions, terrorism, propaganda tirade, and politicization of economy-industrial issues, but to no avail.

The Islamic Republic is too stable to be rocked by rioters and their acts of terrorism, or by attacks on its missions abroad, or by the false narratives of the Farsi TV channels based in the West, or through fake news on the social media, or the sanctions of the US and the European Union, or by the target assassination of its scientists, or by the organized murder of its security personnel and civilians, or by the handful of foul-mouthed scantily-clad women and apostate men claiming to be Iranian (while their attire and demands do not prove this), shouting in the cities of North America and West Europe for change of the system of government in Iran.

Revolutions are set in motion by grassroots movements led by morally upright persons striving to cleanse the society of social ills for establishing a sound and healthy system of government based on the religious/spiritual aspirations of the people to live a dignified life of respect for women and an ethical environment for proper upbringing of children, with firm focus on independence from foreign hegemony and safeguarding of time-honoured and time-tested cultural values.

In other words, the firmly rooted system of governance in Iran cannot be changed by thugs, traitors, terrorists, and all other agents of outside powers who have no faith in Islam, neither respect for public morals, nor sensitivity to the honour and dignity of women, and are intent upon selling Iran to its enemies with complete disregard for the spectacular developments achieved through the untiring efforts of Iranian scholars, scientists, statesmen, economists, politicians, athletes, educationists, and least but not the last, the religious leaders.

Iranians are not naive to allow the immoral outcasts of society or fugitives from justice who have nothing Iranian left in them, to turn Iran into a land of discos, cabarets, casinos, strip-tease clubs, whorehouses, centres of sodomy and lesbians, and nude beaches where wine flows like water, gamblers bring ruin to the society, tabloids publish pornographic material, and fornicators flout all rules of modesty in the name of life, liberty, youth, and women's freedom.

The Iranian people, who chose the Islamic system of government and continue to defend it with their blood, will never bite the bait of the flawed and exploitative system called liberal democracy.

Thus, the latest plot that saw scattered incidents of riots in a few localities of Tehran and parts of some other cities soon petered out, and was a frustrated attempt by the US and West Europe to try to pressure Iran to bow to the blackmail of a breached and deformed JCPOA or else suffer socio-economic damage that would scare away investors, traders, pilgrims, and tourists.

This plot has also failed, as is evident by the planeloads of pilgrims, tourists, traders, investors and officials of the free world arriving in Iran, undeterred by the West's provocative policies and false propaganda of a country in turmoil.

# Iran Taking Retaliatory Measures Against IAEA

TEHRAN -- Iran said Monday it is taking retaliatory measures against the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) over a "politically-motivated" resolution drafted by the U.S. and its European allies.

The United States, Britain, France and Germany had on Thursday brought the motion adopted by the UN agency – the second of its kind within six months.

Iran's Foreign Ministry spokesman Nasser Kanaani announced a response in comments Sunday night.

"In response to the recent action of three European countries and the United States in the adoption of a resolution against Iran, some initial measures have been decided by the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran," he said.

"The implementation of these measures was realized today in the presence of IAEA inspectors in the Natanz and Fordo enrichment complexes," he added, without specifying what the measures were.

He also hinted at the likelihood that the IAEA delegation's next visit to Iran would be canceled.

"The IAEA delegation's trip to Tehran was approved in the framework of the deal with the agency," Kanaani said, adding however that "Iran's next steps will be taken in accordance with the new condi-

tions."

He nonetheless also said that "the Islamic Republic of Iran is always prepared to respond in the appropriate manner to the actions of Western parties when they return to their commitments."

Iranian Foreign Minister Hussein Amir-Abdollahian had on Saturday condemned the resolution, accusing the four countries of trying to exert "maximum pressure" on Tehran amid two months of nationwide protests in the Islamic Republic.

Kanaani on Monday said "the politically-motivated resolution was issued while Iran has the most transparent peaceful nuclear program" in terms of the number of facilities under the supervision of the IAEA compared to other countries and the number of inspections its nuclear activities have undergone by the IAEA.

He stressed that the resolution was enforced after the U.S. and the three European countries exerted pressure on the agency's Board of Governors.

Kanaani also condemned a resolution approved by the United Nations General Assembly's Third Committee on the situation of human rights in the Islamic Republic, stressing that "the politicizing of the human rights issue is not constructive at all".

He further said the resolution that

was proposed by certain Western countries, including Germany, is politically-motivated.

Noting that German has a dark history of violating human rights, the spokesman said, "The German government is not in a position to take such actions against independent countries, including Iran."

The General Assembly's Third Committee on Wednesday approved the draft resolution titled "Situation of human rights in the Islamic Republic of Iran" by a vote of 80 in favor to 28 against, with 68 abstentions.

The draft resolution was proposed over claims of a violent "crack-down" on protests in Iran. Since mid-September, Iran has been rocked by riots after the death of Mahsa Amini.

The 22-year-old fainted at a police station in Tehran and was pronounced dead three days later in hospital.

An official report by Iran's Legal Medicine Organization concluded that Amini's death was caused by illness rather than alleged blows to the head or other vital body organs.

Rioters went on rampage in the country, brutally attacking security officers and causing massive damage to public property as Western powers, especially the United States, provided support.

## Army Receives First Smart Air Defense System

TEHRAN – The commander of the ground forces of the Iranian army on Monday announced the delivery of the first Smart Air Defense System to his force.

Brigadier-General Kioumars Heydari said the army's drone unit has been established, adding all the unnamed vehicles are sophisticated, smart, accurate, and precision-guided.

The defense doctrine of the Islamic Republic of Iran is based on the great stability of the people and indigenous capabilities, and since the eight-year war imposed by Iraq's former Baath regime against Iran, the Islamic Republic has pro-

vided its defense needs by relying on the indigenous capabilities and capacities.

Commander of the Aerospace Force of the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps Brigadier General Amir Ali Hajizadeh said Sunday Iran stands among the world's top countries manufacturing drones and missiles.

Brigadier General Hajizadeh noted that Iran possesses global-level drone power and is now a pioneer in missile technology.

"There are many other achievements, which will be unveiled in due time; for example, the ability to hit enemy at a distance of 1,500

kilometers," the IRGC general added.

Iran stands on par with global powers in terms of unmanned aerial vehicles, and its achievements in this field have challenged the world's powerful armies, he said, adding that in terms of missile technology, Iran stands above the global level.

"The news of the advanced hypersonic ballistic missile, which was broken recently ... and is able to maneuver outside the atmosphere is nothing new, but was just announced recently," the commander said.

He added that Iran's hypersonic

## President Raisi Congratulates Kazakh Counterpart

TEHRAN -- Iran's President Ebrahim Raisi congratulated Kassym-Jomart Tokayev over his re-election in Kazakhstan's presidential election, calling for expansion and deepening of relations in all fields.

Raisi expressed hope that in the new term, as in the past, and in light of the joint cooperation of the officials of the two friendly and brotherly countries, the two sides will witness further deepening of relations.

Tokayev traveled to Iran in August at the official invitation of President Raisi.

The Iranian president's first meeting with his Kazakh counterpart was held on the sidelines of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization summit in Tajikistan last year.

Tokayev received more than 81% of the votes in Sunday's election, according to elections commission chairman Nurlan Abdirov. Five candidates were on the ballot against Tokayev.

Tokayev has pushed through reforms that included strengthening the parliament, reducing presidential powers and limiting the presidency to a single seven-year term.

missile represents a generational growth spurt, and the enemies will not be able to come up with a new technology to counter it for many decades to come.

Hajizadeh announced Iran's homegrown hypersonic ballistic missile on November 10, saying it was capable of penetrating sophisticated aerial defense shields and striking designated targets.

"The missile has a high velocity and can maneuver both in and out of the Earth's atmosphere," he said, noting, "The new missile can pass through all missile defense systems.... It can target the enemy's

TEHRAN – An Armenian diplomat has lauded Iran for its constructive stances in support of the sovereignty of countries and opposition to any change in international borders.

In a meeting with Iranian Foreign Minister Hussein Amir-Abdollahian here, Armenia's Deputy Foreign Minister

Mnatsakan Safaryan expressed Yerevan's gratitude to Iran for its principled and constructive stances on the sovereignty of regional states and for the rejection of any change in international boundaries.

He also described the inauguration of Iran's consulate general in Kapan as a major development

and a milestone in the growing relations between the two neighbors.

Safaryan also highlighted the capacities and infrastructures available for the expansion of economic ties between Armenia and Iran, stressing the need to carry out the previous bilateral agreements.

For his part, Amir-Abdollahian expressed satisfaction with the enhancement of relations between the two friendly neighbors.

He also described the opening of Iran's consulate general in Kapan as a major practical step in boosting the trade exchanges and achieving the goals of economic cooperation.
