# **Deadly Repercussion in Store for Indifference to** Gaza Holocaust

What is happening in Gaza will indeed have deadly repercussions on not just the perpetrators of the holocaust, that is, the illegal Zionist entity and its super terrorist godfather the US but also on those countries, especially Muslim and particularly Arab states passively watching the genocide while enjoying trade and diplomatic ties with usurper Israel.

The days are not far when Israel will definitely be erased from the map of the world and Palestine returned to its indigenous inhabitants.

The sacred al-Aqsa Mosque - Islam's 3rd holiest site - where day before yesterday over 70,000 worshippers held the Friday Congregational Prayer of the first week of blessed Ramadhan despite heavy Zionist restrictions, will certainly be opened to pilgrims from all over the world.

No matter what weapons the US and the European regimes supply to Israel, what military attacks they mount against governments and movements actively defending the persecuted Palestinians with missile/drone barrages, and what hypocrisy they resort to by dropping the so-called relief and food packages on parts of Gaza, victory will eventually be the lot of those who over the past five months have offered more than 31,000 martyrs (mostly children and women).

As a matter of fact, the Joe Biden regime, which is directing the carnage in Gaza, will never succeed in fooling the starving and war-shattered Palestinians to appear as 'humanitarian' either by parachuting so-called relief packages that at times do not open and cause death of innocent people below, or setting up a pier on the besieged enclave on the pretext of facilitating arrival of relief aid by sea.

The plan is actually to help the Zionists to roll in tanks and soldiers into Gaza via the Mediterranean and also to establish an American foothold in the area to worsen the plight of the

This is evident by the daily bombing to death (on Washington's direction, of course) of hundreds of hungry people lined at the border post of Rafah in the hope of receiving some foodstuffs from convoys that manage to trickle in from Egypt's Sinai.

To complete the humiliation of the holocaust-stricken people of Gaza, Jordan, which is almost 50-percent Palestinian populated and shares a long border with the Zionist-controlled West Bank, has joined the Americans in dropping relief packages on parts of Gaza, instead of much needed means of defence to fight the Israeli invaders.

This is indeed self-humiliation for Amman, as well as for Cairo and also for Riyadh, since all three countries have large national armies equipped with state-of-the-art military technology, but have remained indifferent to the genocide in Gaza by issuing toothless verbal condemnations.

This is in sharp contrast to the spirited defence of the people of Gaza by Lebanon's legendry anti-terrorist movement, the Hezbollah, the Hashd ash-Sha'bi or Popular Mobilization Units (PMU) of Iraq, and the Sana'a-based legitimate government of Yemen – which in spite of the attacks by the US and the UK, has made the Red Sea off-limits to Israel.

Still it is not too late for the Arab and regional Muslim states to join the Axis of Resistance for speeding up the goal of liberation of Palestine and uprooting of the illegal Zionist entity which is clearly on its last legs.

If not, history will soon forget these regimes, which might suffer the same fate that is fast approaching for Israel, and is the destiny of the world's most evil-ever regime, the US, as justified repercussion for the crime of the century against the Palestinians.

# Iran Warns Zionists Over 'Brazen' Disintegration Hint

TEHRAN – Following a provocative suggestion by a former Zionist military intelligence officer, Iran's foreign ministry on Saturday vehemently condemned the idea of disintegrating Iran into smaller ethnic states.

Mordechai Kedar, now a research associate at the Begin-Sadat Center for Strategic Studies, expressed his views in the Jerusalem Post, advocating for a "regime change instigated by Iran's ethnic minorities."

Iranian Foreign Ministry spokesperson Nasser Kanaani labeled these comments as insolent and a clear indication of hostile intentions towards Iran.

Kanaani used his X account to highlight that Kedar's comments were not an isolated incident but part of a recurring narrative aimed at undermining Iran's sovereignty.

"Such comments explicitly reveal the sinister intentions of cruel enemies against our dear Iran. This is not the first time that the Zionist enemy has exposed its inner feelings in such a brazen way. The Islamic Republic of Iran has been

subjected to these remarks for more than four decades. It, nevertheless, continues its honorable life more vigorously than ever," Kanaani said.

He pointed out the historical resilience of the Islamic Republic of Iran in the face of such divisive remarks, emphasizing the unity and sacrifices of the Iranian people from various ethnic backgrounds.

Over the past 45 years, nearly 250,000 Iranians have lost their lives defending the country's territorial integrity against external threats, showcasing their dedication to a united Iran, he said.

According to Kanaani, the remarks by the former Israeli official reflect a broader pattern of aggression and ill will towards Iran by its adversaries.

He strongly condemned the actions of those he referred to as criminals, who seek to compensate for their defeats by targeting innocents, including women and children.

"Zionist criminals, who have

buckled under the force of a popular movement in the Gaza Strip and are wantonly massacring women and children in order to compensate for their irreparable defeats, will never live to see their pipe dream of disintegrating Iran fulfilled," Kanaani said.

The diplomat's statement serves as a reminder of Iran's unwavering resolve to remain sovereign and integrated, dismissing the possibility of the country being divided into ethnic states as a mere "dream" of

In the face of such challenges, Iran has consistently demonstrated its ability to maintain national unity and resilience. The statements made by the Foreign Ministry spokesman underscore the determination of the Iranian people to stand against attempts at division and external aggression.

By emphasizing the sacrifices made by Iranians of all ethnicities, Kanaani's response to the hostile remarks not only highlights Iran's

**Prominent** Journalist Urges **Iranian Aid Supplies** for Gaza

TEHRAN -- The head of the Kayhan Group of Newspapers Hussein Shariatmadari says Iran "can and should" deliver humanitarian supplies to Palestinians in the Gaza Strip through maritime routes even if they are attacked by the Zionist

"The Islamic Republic can and should send shipments of food, medicine and other necessities of the people of Gaza to the enclave by the sea," he wrote on the Persian daily Kayhan.

"Undoubtedly, the United States and its Western allies as well as the Zionist regime will oppose the move and it is not unlikely that they will attack the ships carrying the supplies," he said, adding Iran has to send supplies despite the threats.

"Firstly, it will set a lasting precedent for Muslim states. Secondly, the Western states that ostentatiously talk about the need to provide aid to the people of Gaza will be more disgraced and. Thirdly, international authorities can verify that the cargoes are not weapons," Shariatmadari said.

### **Envoys Call for Int'l Action** to Fight Islamophobia GENEVA (Dispatches) --

Iran's top human rights official has urged governments and policymakers across the world to ratify laws and devise policies that would defend Muslims' rights and ensure their all-out inclusion within societies.

Kazem Gharibabadi, secretary of Iran's High Council for Human Rights, made the remarks at a gathering held here to mark the International Day to Combat Islamophobia.

He stressed the need for reinforcement of dialog among various religions and promotion of multiculturalism that can, in turn, contribute to creation of an environment, in which all individuals feel valued and enjoy participation.

The official identified the international day as the day of constant confrontation against discrimination and prejudice, which is faced by millions among the members of the international Muslim community.

Gharibabadi defined the purpose behind naming the day as the International Day to Combat Islamophobia as enhancement of understanding, promotion of tolerance, and defending Mus-

lims' rights. "Islamophobia, which is rooted in ignorance and wrong

information as well as inten-

tional actions, manifests itself in various forms, such as hatemongering, violent attacks, and institutionalized and unfortunately government-sponsored discrimination," he said.

Over the past three decades, the infamous phenomenon has emerged in various forms, including publication of sacrilegious cartoons and profane books as well as the burning of the Holy Qur'an, the official noted.

"All these instances of Islamophobia leaves its impact on various societies, and leads to discrimination and incidence of violent behaviors against Muslim communities," he stated.

On the occasion of the international day, various communities, organizations, and individuals had to come together to condemn Islamophobia and its pernicious effects on social integrity, Gharibabadi urged.

The United Nations declared March 15 as the International Day to Combat Islamophobia through a resolution back in 2022. In doing so, the world body

urged nations across the international community to adopt clear stances and measures aimed at confronting hatred, discrimination, and violence against Muslims around the globe.
