## In the Name of the Most High Viewpoint

### Emerging New World Order Augurs End of American Hegemony

*The two-day International Conference in Tehran that concluded on Saturday and tilted "the New World Order Geometry" was held at the appropriate time when significant changes are happening in the region and the world, much to the exasperation of the US and its hegemonic accomplices.*

*In Moscow the foreign ministers of Russia and Iran held quadrilateral talks attended by their counterparts of the unwarranted antagonists – Turkey and Syria – ending in a cordial atmosphere with emphasis of all the four countries on defusing the crisis fanned for the past dozen years by American and West European regimes in league with the illegal Zionist entity.*

*It is indeed the sign of the new world order evolving in the region and abroad as was noticed last Wednesday in the Egyptian capital Cairo where the Arab League foreign ministers welcomed back founding member Syria, which in 2011 was boycotted in violation of the charter of the Arab League itself, because of pressures from Washington.*

*There is a possibility of Syria's President Dr. Bashar al-Assad personally attending the forthcoming Arab League summit in Riyadh on May 19, following the visits to Damascus of high ranking delegations from several Arab countries, including Saudi Arabia eager for normalizing diplomatic and trade ties.*

*This has clearly annoyed the US, whose terroristic hordes have killed at least 300,000 Syrian people over the past twelve years and displaced millions from their homes and hearths in an aborted bid to overthrow the legal government of President Assad.*

*These rapid positive developments on the heels of restoration of ties between the Islamic Republic of Iran and Saudi Arabia which will soon reopen their embassies in each other's capitals along with consulates in major cities, is driving the US and Israel mad.*

*This is among the reasons for the ongoing atrocities of the Zionist entity in Gaza, where men, women, and children are being indiscriminately killed by Israeli air attacks, which are also a bid to deflect attention from the crisis raging in Occupied Palestine as a result of the resentment of hundreds of thousands of the illegal Jewish settlers for having been deceitfully lured into an unstable land that holds no future for them.*

## IRGC Equips Vessels With 2,000-km Range Missiles

TEHRAN -- The commander of Iran's Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) Navy said Saturday his force has furnished its vessels with homegrown naval cruise missiles with a range of 2,000 kilometers, amid efforts by specialists and technicians to develop state-of-the-art munitions and equipment.

Rear Admiral Alireza Tangsiri told Tasnim news agency that the missile, dubbed Qadr-474, has been installed on the indigenous Shahid Mahdavi oceangoing warship.

Built by Iranian experts and technicians, Shahid Mahdavi is a multi-purpose heavy warship for long-range operations. It weighs more than 2,100 tons and is 240 meters in length and 27 meters in width.

The warship is already armed with Abu Mahdi cruise missiles, which feature state-of-the-art technologies suitable for electronic warfare and have a range of over one thousand kilometers, as well as another domestically-developed

missile with a range of 750 kilometers.

Abu Mahdi and the other two cruise missiles are smart, can be guided and go after a new target before explosion, and can be launched even from regions deep in the land and behind the mountains to hit naval targets, Tangsiri said.

Tangsiri said the advanced Shahid Soleimani patrol combat warship, named after top Iranian anti-terror commander Lieutenant General Qassem Soleimani, has also been equipped with long-range Qadr-474 cruise missiles.

The warship has been furnished with various types of missiles with ranges of 200, 300 and 750 kilometers, Tangsiri said.

The IRGC Navy will take delivery of four Shahid Soleimani-class vessels in the current Iranian calendar year, which ends on March 20, 2024, he said.

The vessels that would join the IRGC Navy fleet are Shahid

Sayyad Shirazi, named after the late former deputy chief of staff of Iran's Armed Forces, Shahid Bagheri drone aircraft carrier, and Abu Mahdi al-Muhandis warship.

The last warship has been named after the former deputy head of Iraq's Popular Mobilization Units who was assassinated along with Lt. Gen. Soleimani in a U.S. drone strike near Baghdad airport in January 2020.

The new military catamarans can cruise at the speed of 45 nautical knots, and can launch rockets with a range of between 300 and 750 kilometers.

The fourth indigenous warship has been named after Rais Ali Delvari, a great national hero and independence fighter who led the anti-colonial struggle in southern Iran, Tangsiri said.

Iranian military experts and engineers have in recent years made remarkable breakthroughs in manufacturing a broad range of indigenous (Continued on Page 7)

### Saudi, Iranian FMs Discuss Latest in Détente Efforts

TEHRAN -- Iranian Foreign Minister Hussein Amir-Abdollahian and his Saudi counterpart have discussed the latest developments in bilateral relations and underlined the need for promotion of cooperation between the two neighbors.

Amir-Abdollahian and Saudi Arabia's Foreign Minister Prince Faisal bin Farhan Al Saud held talks on the phone on Friday evening, during which the top Iranian diplomat expressed satisfaction with the progress of mutual agree-

ments, including the face-to-face meeting of the foreign ministers of the two countries, announcement of the resumption of diplomatic relations, and dispatch of technical teams to reopen embassies and consulates.

Amir-Abdollahian said the Islamic Republic is preparing to officially reopen its embassy and consulates in Saudi Arabia.

He described planned meetings between senior Iranian and Saudi officials as a manifestation of the

two sides' strong resolve to cooperate and cultivate intimate relations.

Farhan said Riyadh sees bright prospects for relations with Tehran and that the kingdom will spare no efforts to strengthen them.

"We have taken good steps in the past two months, and our adherence to the signed agreements shows our steely determination," he said.

The top Saudi diplomat also pointed to Iran's age-old participation (Continued on Page 7)

### Daesh Element, Police Killers, Media Mole Arrested

TEHRAN -- Iranian security forces have arrested a member of the Daesh terrorist group in the country's southeastern province of Sistan and Baluchestan.

Doostali Jalilian, the provincial police chief, said Saturday that the forces found out after "technical and intelligence measures" that a Daesh member was secretly living in a village in Zabol.

"After the close monitoring of the person's actions, his hiding place was finally identified and the Daesh member was arrested in a synergic and coordinated operation by the police and Intelligence Department," Jalilian said.

According to the police chief of Sistan and Baluchestan,

primary investigations revealed that the person in question, a citizenship of a neighboring country, was promoting the terror outfit in the area with a "purposeful plan."

Several people suspected of involvement in the assassination of a senior police commander in southern Iran have been arrested, police chief of Hormozgan province Brigadier Gholamreza Jafari said on Saturday.

On Thursday, Major Muhammadreza Assadollahi was martyred by drug traffickers during an operation in Bandar-e Lengeh, a major port on the Persian Gulf coast. He was chief station office at the nearby port of Charak.

Jafari said the hideouts of the suspects were identified in a complicated operation, adding that security forces had also seized two vehicles from the smugglers.

Intelligence forces have also arrested an element affiliated with anti-Revolution media outlets in Golestan province in northern Iran, IRNA reported on Saturday.

A statement from the Iranian Intelligence Ministry said the element was arrested because of his role in sowing ethnical and religious sedition in Golestan which is home to a sizable community of Sunni people of Turkmen origin.

### Iran Reiterates Support for Palestinian Resistance

TEHRAN -- The commander of the Quds Force of the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) said Saturday Iran will continue to provide unwavering support for the Palestinian resistance until the final annihilation of the occupying regime of Israel.

Addressing a ceremony in commemoration of his fallen comrades in Mashhad, Brigadier General Esmail Qa'ani said Iran will back the "strong heroic front" to the greatest extent possible, both verbally and in practice.

Young Palestinian fighters have at times carried out more than 30 retaliatory operations in a single day against the Zionist regime in the occupied West Bank, Qa'ani said, adding this is the fruit of the resistance front and global mobilization of Muslims.

He said the resistance front has grown into an extensive axis, which has connected different sources and points of resistance in the world together.

"This front has drawn together altruist, educated and erudite people who share many points in common," he said. "The main commonality among them is their longing to defend Islam, the honor of Muslims. They defend themselves and others collectively."

Brigadier General Qa'ani described the mass mobilization of Muslim resistance fighters as an ideal commanded by the late founder of the Islamic Republic, Imam Khomeini, and achieved by Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei.

Over the years, Iran has spared no efforts to support resistance movements and repeatedly called resistance the sole way to free Palestine from Israel's decades-long occupation.

For their part, regional resistance forces have lauded Iran for its unwavering support for them. On Friday, Iranian Foreign Minister Hussein Amir-Abdollahian held separate phone conversations with Ismail Haniyeh, the head of the political bureau of Hamas, and Ziyad al-Nakhlah, the secretary-general of Islamic Jihad.
