Iranian-Arab Dialogue Conference Told: West Asia Peace Hinges on Disarmament of Israel

TEHRAN -- Iran says the establishment of full and genuine peace, stability and security in the West Asia region hinges on the disarmament of Israel and an end to its occupation of Palestine.

Iranian Foreign Minister Hussein Amir-Abdollahian made the remarks in an address to the third Iranian-Arab Dialogue Conference, dubbed "For Cooperation and Interaction", in Tehran on Sunday.

He added that the people of Palestine have been deprived of all their rights and Israel's "unequal war" in Gaza over the past seven months once more showed the reality of the Palestinian issue to the world.

The Zionist regime was established on the basis of violation of Palestinians' rights, occupation, warmongering and extremism and lacks the potential to have peaceful coexistence with regional nations, he noted.

Amir-Abdollahian lashed out at the United States for providing Israel with full and unconditional support for the regime's crimes and genocide

against the people of Palestine.

The U.S. has also violated all its false and deceptive claims of advocating peace, democracy and human rights, he said.

Amir-Abdollahian said sustainable peace and stability will not be established in Palestine and the Arab-Islamic region unless the rights of the Palestinian people are realized.

He emphasized that regional nations, particularly Palestinians, have no option but to continue their resistance to achieve their absolute rights.

As a responsible actor and supporter of international peace and security, Iran stresses the importance of holding a referendum as a political solution to the Palestinian issue and establishing a Middle East free of nuclear weapons, the foreign minister added.

He said Iran expresses its full readiness to cooperate with the regional and neighboring countries as well as the member states of the Muslim and Arab world.

The Islamic Republic will spare no

effort to realize the Palestinian people's cause, he added.

Elsewhere in his address, Amir-Abdollahian reiterated Iran's determination to deepen understanding and convergence among the regional countries, saying the restoration of relations between Iran and Saudi Arabia is an indication of such a policy.

Iran and Saudi Arabia enjoy ample capacities and capabilities which can be used to boost cooperation in the region and the Muslim world, he added.

He noted that Iran seriously heeds the promotion of ties with other Persian Gulf littoral states.

Iran has started to enhance its relations with the United Arab Emirates, Qatar, Oman and Kuwait and welcomes Bahrain's move to release detainees on political charges, the foreign minister emphasized.

"We believe that today we have passed the phase of Iranian-Arab dialogue and have entered into regional dialogue... We are now in the stage of regional cooperation," Amir-Abdollahian said.

Iran: U.S. Has Guantanamo, Zionist Regime Has Negev

TEHRAN -- The spokesman for Iran's Foreign Ministry said Monday American and Israeli human rights are two sides of the same coin as they both commit gross rights violations against prisoners.

In a post on his X account, Nasser Kan'ani said the results of an investigation conducted by CNN show that the Zionist regime's military forces are torturing Palestinian prisoners in a secret detention center in the Negev region in occupied Palestine.

"The American and Zionist human rights are two sides of the same coin, one in Negev, and the other in Guantanamo and Abu Ghraib," he wrote.

The CNN report, released on Friday, cited statements from whistleblowers working at Israel's Sde Teiman military detention camp which showed that the regime has been committing systemic abuses against people it has detained during its ongoing war on Gaza.

The witnesses said Palestin-

ian prisoners have been restrained, blindfolded, and forced to wear diapers during their detention time in Sde Teiman which is located in the Negev desert, in the south of the Israeli-occupied Palestinian territories near Gaza.

Prisoners were not allowed to move, talk, or even peek when they were blindfolded while guards unleashed large dogs on sleeping detainees or beat them out of spite and for revenge, the report said of the prison.

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Senior Diplomat, UN Special Envoy Discuss Afghanistan Security

TEHRAN -- The United Nations and international organizations must focus on promoting peace, security and welfare in Afghanistan, Iranian Deputy Foreign Minister for Political Affairs Ali Bagheri Kani says.

Bagheri Kani made the remarks in a meeting in Tehran with Roza Isakovna Otunbayeva, the special representative of the UN secretary-general for Afghanistan.

He said the U.S. presence in Afghanistan was the source of instability, insecurity, and exacerbated the threat of terrorism and cultivation of narcotics in the war-ravaged country.

International organizations

in Afghanistan should give priority to securing the interests of the Afghan people, improving their living conditions and welfare and guaranteeing the country's security, he added.

The Iranian diplomat emphasized that Western countries, particularly the U.S., must make up for the damage they inflicted on the Afghan people and the entire region in more than two decades.

The United Nations shoulders the responsibility to play a constructive role in establishing peace and stability in Afghanistan, Bagheri Kani said.

He also highlighted the importance of making all the necessary

preparations for the repatriation of educated and skillful Afghan nationals living in other countries, including Iran, and using their capacities for the development of the country.

Otunbayeva, for her part, pointed to the complexity of issues in Afghanistan and the multiplicity of actors, stressing the need to coordinate the positions of regional and extra-regional countries to help promote the country's development and stability.

She called for Iran's help to strengthen constructive cooperation among regional and extra-regional countries and interact with

IRGC Chief: Iran Hits Heart of Global Arrogance Without Fear

TEHRAN -- The chief commander of the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) said Monday Iran has become so powerful that it "fearlessly" attacks the heart of the global arrogance.

"The fact that the Islamic Republic attacks the heart of the global arrogance fearlessly and with the knowledge of all-round enmity and consequences shows the people's power of faith, resistance, will and progress," Major General Hussein Salami said in Semnan Province.

Referring to Iran's recent Operation True Promise against Israel, Salami said, "By relying on the strength and power of the zealous Iranian nation, the operation was not carried out as a surprise, but by taking responsibility for it and broadcasting its images."

"From the very first moments of the operation, Iranians took to the streets to express their support for the retaliatory attack and the IRGC," he said.

On April 14, Iran fired more than 300 drones and missiles at military bases in the Israeli-occupied territories.

The large-scale attack, dubbed Operation True Promise, was a response to a terrorist Israeli raid against Iran's consulate in the Syrian capital Damascus that killed 13 people, including seven IRGC military advisors.

Salami also noted that Iran achieved success whenever it faced obstacles and sanctions.

"The power of the Islamic Republic establishment today is the outcome of resistance and progress in an endless war in multiple forms with different countries of the world," he said.

The Iranian nation turned sanctions into an opportunity for advancement in various fields, the IRGC chief added.

Salami said, "The enemy's idea of sanctioning Iran was to paralyze and make it surrender, however, our nation turned the sanction into an opportunity for progress, and this power's great achievements have been displayed to the world in various fields today."

The IRGC chief asserted that the key to overcoming sanctions and problems is "being with the people."

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What Ails Arab States From Demanding Arrest of Genocidaire Netanyahu?

The ongoing holocaust in Gaza has awakened human conscience all over the world and exposed the illegal Zionist entity and its principal comrade-in-crimes in the genocide of the Palestinians as rapacious beasts deserving unconditional condemnation.

The denunciation of the devils in human form in Tel Aviv has erased political divisions, ethnical boundaries, geographical distances, and religious barriers.

An example in this regard is the clear call by the president of faraway Colombia in South America for the arrest of child-killer Benjamin Netanyahu in accordance with the expected ruling in this regard of the International Criminal Court (ICC)

The commendable stance of the Colombian head of state, who earlier this month severed diplomatic ties with Israel in protest to the mass massacre of over 35,000 civilians so far, should open the eyes of certain Arab states in the vicinity of Palestine for their failure to flay Netanyahu.

Even Bolivia has cut diplomatic ties with the Zionist entity, while several other Latin American countries, such as Chile, Peru, Honduras, and Brazil, have recalled their ambassadors from Tel Aviv in protest to the slaughter of the Gazans.

It is a matter of shame for Jordan, Egypt, Morocco, Bahrain, and the UAE, for their refusal to sever diplomatic ties with Israel despite the intensity of its crimes against fell Arabs and Muslims of Palestine.

These regimes are even ignoring the just demands of their own people for at least cutting all ties with the illegal Zionist entity and allowing them to march to the support of the persecuted Palestinian people, if they lack the courage to send arms and ammunition to Gaza.

At a time when university students all over the globe, especially in the US and Europe, have thrown their full support for the cause of the liberation of Palestine it is nothing short of treason on the part of these Arab states to maintain ties with the Zionist entity and bow to American pressures.

It seems they are oblivious of their doomed fate since mere verbal condemnation of usurper Israel without activating their armies and armaments is bound to earn the displeasure of the All-Merciful Lord and expose them to Divine Wrath.
