IMIDRO: Annual Mineral Exports Top \$13bn



TEHRAN – The value of Iran's export of minerals in the previous Persian calendar year (ended on March 19) stood at \$13.7 billion, the Iranian Mines and Mining Industries Development and Renovation Organization (IMIDRO) announced. According to IMIDRO, the value of Iran's export of minerals and mineral industries in the last year registered a nine percent increase compared to a year earlier.

The report added that \$7.3 billion worth of mining and mineral products were imported into Iran from March 2023 to March 2024, showing a 35 percent rise compared to a year earlier.

Iran is one of the top 10 mineralrich countries in the world. Having 15,000 mining areas, Iran has the sixth largest zinc, seventh largest copper, ninth largest iron ore reserves, and fifth largest gypsum and barite reserves globally. It also has three of the world's total lead and zinc reserves and huge coal reserves. Other mineral products such as chromate and manganese are also found in different regions of Iran.

The total proven reserves of Iran's mines are estimated at about 60 billion tons, which is expected to reach more than 100 billion tons with the implementation of the Industry, Mining, and Trade Ministry's exploration programs over 500,000 square kilometers of new mineral zones.

Tehran, Moscow to Expand Joint Cooperation in Gas Technologies Field

TEHRAN – Director of the corporate planning of the National Iranian Gas Company Hussein Ali Muhammad Husseini in a meeting with the energy officials of the Russian Federation stressed the need to enhance bilateral cooperation between the two countries in the gas industry.

Energy officials from Iran and Russia emphasized expanding and developing bilateral cooperation in the field of gas technologies.

He said the two sides should identify the capacities and opportunities for more cooperation and coordination in the field.

Muhammad Husseini pointed to the willingness of Iran to expand relations with Russia in the energy sector and said the country welcomes the suggestion of Russia's Ministry of Energy on setting up a specialized panel discussion in the fields of digitization, monitoring and analyzing data in the Russia Energy Week and also in Energy



Congress in St. Petersburg.

Elsewhere in his remarks, the NIGC director emphasized the need for sharing common experiences in areas such as reducing the amount of gas loss, and improving gas installations' safety against sabotages and terrorist attacks and added that Iran enjoys significant capacities for exporting, importing, refining and transmitting gas and is ready to enhance its cooperation with Russia in this field.

The representatives and authorities of the Russian Federation emphasized the need to identify capacities and opportunities for more coordination.

Ministry of Agriculture to Focus on Export-Based Productions

TEHRAN – Iran's Minister of Agriculture Muhammad Ali Nikbakht said his ministry is concentrating on export-based production in the current Iranian calendar year (started March 20, 2024).

Speaking in a session held in the presence of senior managers of the ministry, Nikbakht said more than \$1 billion of agricultural products were exported from the country in the previous Iranian calendar year (March 21, 2023, to March 19, 2024), showing a 13 and 23 percent hike in weight and value respectively compared to a year earlier.

He pointed to the current year's motto "Production Jump with the People's Participation" and added that his ministry will make efforts to materialize the objectives of the motto.

Nikbakht called on the responsible organizations and companies to provide exporters of agricultural products with the necessary facilities in order to spur exports and export activities, IRNA reported.

Elsewhere in his remarks, the agriculture minister termed investing in the aquaculture and fisheries sectors as an opportunity for realizing the goals of the production jump, noting that fisheries and aquaculture sectors have ample capacities and they can also improve the productivity of soil and water.

Boeing's Woes Have Cost Lufthansa 'a Lot of Money,' CEO Says

ZURICH (Reuters) - Aircraft delivery delays from Boeing, opens new tab are "extremely annoying" and cost Lufthansa, opens new tab lots of money, but the U.S. planemaker should be able to resolve its problems, the German airline's CEO said in a newspaper interview.

BIS: Iran's Deposits With Foreign Banks Exceed \$13bn

TEHRAN – The Bank for International Settlements (BIS) put Iran's total deposits with foreign banks and financial institutions at more than \$13 billion.

The BIS said Iran's financial transactions with foreign banks in the 4th quarter of 2023 registered a 10 percent growth.

In its latest report, the bank put the amount of Iran's deposits with foreign financial institutions and banks at the end of 4th quarter of 2023 at \$13.143 billion.

Iran's deposits with foreign banks and financial institutions increased by \$1.148 billion in the 4th quarter of 2023, showing a nine percent hike compared to the same period in 2022, the report added.

It said Iran's total financial transactions with foreign banks and financial institutions in the 4th quarter of 2023 exceeded \$14.140 billion, showing a 10% growth compared to the 3rd quarter of the same year. Iran's total foreign transactions with foreign banks and financial institutions in the 3rd quarter of 2023 hit \$12.832 billion, the report added.

The Bank for International Settlements is headquartered in Basel, Switzerland, and its reports are released four times a year entitled "International Banking and Financial Market Developments".

Chinese Companies Win More Bids to Explore for Iraq Oil, Gas

BAGHDAD (Reuters) - Chinese companies won four bids to explore Iraqi oil and gas fields, Iraq's oil minister said as the Middle Eastern country's hydrocarbon exploration licensing round continued into its second day.

The oil and gas licenses for 29 projects are mainly aimed at ramping up output for domestic use, with more than 20 companies prequalifying, including European, Chinese, Arab and Iraqi groups.

Chinese companies have been the only foreign players to win bids, taking nine oil and gas fields since

Saturday, while Iraqi Kurdish company KAR Group took two.

There were notably no U.S. oil majors involved, even after Iraqi Prime Minister Mohammed Shia met representatives of U.S. companies on an official visit to the United States last month.

China's National Offshore Oil Corp. (CNOOC) -Iraq won a bid to develop Iraq's Block 7 for oil exploration that extends across the country's central and southern provinces of Diwaniya, Babil, Najaf, Wasit and Muthanna, said oil minister Hayan Abdul Ghani. ZhenHua, Anton Oilfield Services and Sinopec won bids to develop the Abu Khaymah oilfield in Muthanna, the Dhufriya field in Wasit and the Summer field in Muthanna respectively, the minister said.

Iraq's main goal with its sixth licensing round was to increase gas output that it wants to use to fire power plants that rely heavily on gas imported from Iran.

However, no bids were made on at least two fields with large gas potential, potentially undermining those efforts.
