# **UNRWA: 50,000 Palestinian Children Require Treatment for Acute Malnutrition**

NEW YORK (Dispatches) - The UN agency for Palestinian refugees (UNRWA) reported on Saturday that over 50,000 children in the Gaza Strip are in urgent need of treatment for acute malnutrition.

In a statement, the agency said that "with continued restrictions to humanitarian access, people in Gaza continue to face desperate levels of hunger."

"Over 50,000 children require treatment for acute malnutrition," it added.

"UNRWA teams work tirelessly to reach families with aid but the situation is catastrophic," the agency said. Meanwhile, UNICEF Spokesperson James Elder told Al Jazeera on Saturday a UNICEF aid truck carrying nutritional and medical supplies for 10,000 children from Deir El-Balah to Gaza City was denied access by Zionist troops on Wednesday.

Their task was to deliver the aid, which was preapproved by regime authorities, from Deir El-Balah to Gaza City, a 40km (25 miles)

round trip.

"It took 13 hours and we spent the besieged enclave. eight of those around checkpoints, arguing around paperwork – was it a truck or a van," he said.

"The reality is, this truck was denied access. Those 10,000 children did not get that aid," he said."Israel as the occupying power has the legal responsibility to facilitate that aid," he added.

Elder described how difficult it has been to not only get aid into harrowing violence and displace-

On Tuesday, UNICEF said in a statement that almost 3,000 children have been cut off from treatment for moderate and severe acute malnutrition in southern Gaza, putting them at risk of death as

ment continue to impact access to healthcare facilities and services for desperate families.

The agency said the number equates to approximately threequarters of the 3,800 children who are receiving life-saving care in the South of the besieged Strip as the conflict in Rafah escalates.

Nearly 37,300 Palestinians have been killed in Gaza by the Zionist troops since October last year, most of them women and children, and almost 85,200 others injured, according to local health authorities.

More than eight months into the Israeli onslaught, vast tracts of Gaza lay in ruins amid a crippling blockade of food, clean water, and medicine.

Israel is accused of genocide at the International Court of Justice, whose latest ruling ordered Tel Aviv to immediately halt its aggression in Rafah, where more than 1 million Palestinians had sought refuge from the war before it was invaded on May 6.

Reflection on the verses related to Hajj and contemplation on the acts and rituals of this unparalleled obligation, reveal these matters and similar secrets and mysteries as these that exist within the intricate arrangement that constitutes Hajj.

Brothers and sisters, as pilgrims undertaking Hajj, you are currently in a place where you can practice these truths and luminous teachings. Bring your thoughts and actions closer and closer to these, and bring back to your homes a reformed identity infused with these lofty concepts. This is the valuable, real souvenir of your Hajj journey.

This year, the issue of bara'at [renunciation of the polytheists] is more significant than ever before. The tragedies in Gaza, which are unparalleled in our contemporary history, along with the audacity of the ruthless Zionist regime, which is the embodiment of cruelty and villainy, and of course the declining state of Zionism, leave no room for any consideration or tolerance by any individual, party, government or Muslim denomination.

## **Report: U.S. Frustrated by Israeli Demands** for Better Intel Sharing

WASHINGTON (Dispatches) -Some U.S. officials are frustrated with demands by the Zionist regime to provide more intelligence than the United States is already sharing, the Washington Post reported.

The United States has provided the regime with drone footage, satellite imagery, communications intercepts and other forms of intelligence in the wake of Palestinian organization Hamas' October 7

However, Zionist regime officials believe that the United States has not provided any sort of intelligence that they could not have gathered themselves, the report said.

## Poll: 70% of Zionists Say Diplomacy on Hamas Unsuccessful

WEST BANK (Dispatches) - More than 70 percent of Israelis say they think the Zionist regime's public diplomacy on the October 7 operation by Palestinian resistance movement Hamas has been unsuccessful, according to a survey.

As the occupying regime continues its military onslaught on the Gaza Strip, Zionist prime minister Benjamin Netanyahu's popularity continues to plummet, with a recent opinion poll showing former War Cabinet member Benny Gantz with more public support.

According to a poll published Friday by Israeli daily Maariv, only 35% of respondents believe Netanyahu is fit for the position of prime minister, while 41% prefer Gantz, who is also the leader of the National Unity Party, resigned Sunday from the emergency cabinet.

The results of the Lazar Institute poll also

showed that 24% of the random sample of 501 Israelis had no answer for their choice of premier. A clear majority of respondents, 74%, said they think Israeli public diplomacy on the October 7 operation by Palestinian fighters has been unsuccessful.

In contrast, only 15% believed it successful, while 11% had no opinion. According to the poll results, if elections were held on the same day, the National Unity party would secure 24 out of 120 seats in the Knesset, or the regime's parliament.

The Likud party, led by Netanyahu, would have 21 seats and the Yesh Atid party, headed by opposition leader Yair Lapid, would get 15.

The newspaper noted that the bloc supporting Netanyahu's cabinet would secure 52 seats, while the opposition would obtain 58 and Arab representatives 10.

Given Netanyahu's reluctance to hold

early elections, there are no imminent prospects of a vote in the occupied territories, which has faced international condemnation amid its continued brutal onslaught on Gaza since October 7, 2023. The Israeli media stressed that after eight months of living in an area that has turned into a "security belt," settlers express "feelings of anger and disappointment ... due to the long time that has passed without their needs and crisis being addressed."

Yiftah Ron-Tal, a major general reserve in Israel's occupation army, said Friday that Hezbollah had established a "security zone" at the northern border with Lebanon.

Ron-Tal said Israel had lost control over the Galilee region adjacent to the Lebanese border, and Kiryat Shmona, a populated town in the north, had been evacuated by settlers.

On Friday, Hezbollah deputy head Sheikh Naim Qassem warned the Zionist regime of a "decisive" response in case of expanding the scope of its war on Lebanese soil.

"With the fear of exceeding the limits that could lead to war, Israel is trying to seize opportunities and work on limited expansion, but we have a decision that any expansion, no matter how limited, will be met with a decisive response that will... inflict great losses on the Israelis," Sheikh Qassem said.
