### Terroristic Canada Told: Physician Heal Thyself

Canada is the name of a large swath of North America seized by Britain from the native Amerindian tribes whom the occupiers almost exterminated and which today functions as a comrade-in-crimes against humanity to the United States of America, especially in Washington's wars overseas and the terroristic policy of sanctions against independent countries.

Its policies are fundamentally flawed and it has a negative record against the Free World, as is evident by two of its military misadventures over the past two decades.

The first was in Somalia where as part of the NATO forces sent by the United Nations in 1992 during the civil war for the so-called "Operation Restore Hope", it indulged in racist crimes against the black people from the Petawawa base.

The Canadian soldiers used to harass the Somali Muslims and shoot them for no reason, to the extent that they made bets with each other on how brutally to kill the black people.

This systematic killing and torture of the Somali people, including sexual abuse, remains to this day as an indelible blot on Canada and its army of white supremacist soldiers.

The second and more fully documented scandal of the Canadian army was in the 2001 US occupation of Afghanistan where, as part of the NATO intruding forces the Afghan people, mostly civilians, were shot and killed in cold blood as target practice.

To this day, the Afghan Muslim people intensely hate the Canadians for their brutalities, noting that torture included the pulling out of fingernails and toenails, burning with hot oil, and beatings.

In 2011, these crimes against humanity by the notorious Canadian terroristic army, were published on many websites, titled "Canada's Shameful Legacy of Torture in Afghanistan".

Thus, the Ottawa regime, whose plot to blame Iran for an accidental plane crash was recently been dismissed after thorough investigation of the Ukraine aircraft incident, has in sheer frustration labelled as 'terrorist' a humanitarian organization such as the IRGC, which is known for its defence of the oppressed, and maintenance of peace and security.

# Iran Warns Israel Against Full-Scale War on Hezbollah

UNITED NATIONS (Dispatches) -- Iran has warned the occupying regime of Israel about the consequences of waging an all-out war on Lebanon's Hezbollah resistance group.

Iran's mission to the UN said in a statement Israel would be the "ultimate loser" of any military action against Lebanon.

"Undoubtedly, this war will have one ultimate loser, which is the Zionist regime. The Lebanese resistance movement, Hezbollah, has the capability to defend itself and Lebanon – perhaps the time for the self-annihilation of this illegitimate regime has come," it said.

The statement said Hezbollah is capable of defending both itself and Lebanon. It also warned that any action by Israel against Lebanon could plunge the region into a new conflict.

"Any imprudent decision by the

occupying Israeli regime to save itself could plunge the region into a new war, the consequence of which would be the destruction of Lebanon's infrastructure as well as that of the 1948 occupied territories," the statement noted.

The Zionist regime and Hezbollah have been exchanging fire along Lebanon's southern border almost on a daily basis since the Gaza onslaught began on October 7.

The tensions have flared over the past week especially after Israel assassinated a senior Hezbollah commander last week.

The exchange of fire has intensified following the Israeli assassination of senior Hezbollah commander Sami Taleb Abdallah.

The movement has retaliated by firing hundreds of rockets into the northern parts of the occupied ter-

ritories.

Hezbollah says its operations are meant to support the Gaza resistance and to put pressure on the regime to stop the genocide in Gaza, which has so far left more than 37,500 Gazans dead, most of them women and children.

On Tuesday, the Israeli military said it had approved plans for an attack on Lebanon, raising concerns that the regime might carry out threats that it will turn Lebanon into another Gaza.

Hezbollah's Secretary-General Seyyed Hassan Nasrallah warned that "no place" in the Israeli-occupied territories would "be spared our rockets" if a wider war began.

Nasrallah emphasized that an incursion into the Galilee region remains an option on the table should Israel invade southern Lebanon.

## ACD Foreign Ministers Begin Meeting in Tehran

TEHRAN – Iran on Sunday will be hosting the 19th Asia Cooperation Dialogue (ACD) ministerial meeting here, with more than 30 delegations participating in the event.

Iran's Foreign Ministry is playing host to the ACD meeting of foreign ministers on Sunday and Monday, where they will discuss ways to promote and enhance cooperation among the members.

On Sunday, the first day of the summit, experts and senior executives from ACD member states will coordinate topics to be discussed by senior diplomats the following day.

The foreign ministers will discuss and exchange opinions to make the best use of the ACD, as the only pan-

Asian forum, and its diverse resources in building partnerships and bridging the gap between Asian countries and other regional forums.

Iran's acting foreign minister, Ali Bagheri Kani, will deliver a speech at the opening ceremony of the summit on Monday.

More than 30 foreign delegations at the level of ministers, deputy ministers or relevant deputies of foreign ministers, general secretaries of regional organizations and special envoys of member countries will participate in this meeting hosted by Iran's Foreign Ministry.

Iran has assumed the presidency of the ACD since late 2023.

The first of its kind in Asia, the Asia

Cooperation Dialogue is a continent-wide forum, which was inaugurated in Thailand in 2002. Its headquarters is based in Kuwait.

The forum has 35 Asian member countries, and in the last two years' chairmanship was up to Bahrain.

More specifically, the ACD aims to constitute a missing link in Asia by incorporating every Asian country and building an Asian Community without duplicating other organizations or creating a bloc against others.

A key principle is to consolidate Asian strengths and fortify Asia's competitiveness by maximizing the diversity and rich resources evident in Asia.

## Envoy: Iran Hosts 6 Million Afghans at Annual Cost of \$10bn

NEW YORK (Dispatches) -- Iran's ambassador to the UN has highlighted the country's efforts to deal with extremism and underdevelopment in Afghanistan, saying Iran is ready to play an active role in the neighboring country's reconstruction.

Amir Saeid Iravani made the remarks at a UN Security Council meeting on the situation in Afghanistan and the urgency of providing humanitarian aid to the conflict-ridden country.

"Afghanistan continues to face severe economic and humanitarian crises, worsened by a significant reduction in international aid. This situation is profound-

ly affecting many people, particularly women and children," Iravani said.

UN estimates show 23.7 million Afghans will need humanitarian assistance in 2024, he added.

Afghanistan is still reeling from a decades-long U.S. occupation and its hasty withdrawal which resulted in the country's lightning takeover by the Taliban.

Iravani asserted that any "politicization of aid" will harm the Afghan people. "Iran advocates for addressing extremism, terrorism and underdevelopment in Afghanistan, and stands ready to play an active role in its reconstruction."

He said Tehran continues economic and commercial ties with Afghanistan to promote peace and stability and strengthen the Afghan economy.

"Terrorist threats from within Afghanistan continue to pose significant concerns. Iran doubts the de facto authorities' ability to combat these threats effectively," Iravani said. "Continuous international engagement with De facto authorities is crucial for regional peace and stability."

The Iranian envoy also noted that instability affects neighboring countries and highlighted the need for regional and international

## Gen. Hajizadeh: Zionists Pleaded Iran Not to Respond

TEHRAN -- A high-ranking commander of the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) said Saturday Iran's retaliatory operation prompted Israeli authorities to cry out for no action from the Islamic Republic.

Brigadier General Amir Ali Hajizadeh, the commander of the IRGC's Aerospace Division, said Zionist officials made a grave miscalculation by launching attacks against the consular section of Iran's embassy in the Syrian capital in early April.

"Iranian officials are not seeking a war. Nevertheless, they honor certain red lines which Israelis had not taken into consideration. They (Israeli authorities) did not expect Iran to respond," Hajizadeh stated.

The IRGC general said Israeli officials came to know about Iran's definite decision for the punitive strike following Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei's speech on April 10, when he said the Tel Aviv regime "must be punished and will be punished" for its deadly strike on the Iranian diplomatic mission.

"They (Israeli officials) conveyed their threats through intermediaries, but they realized days later that Iran would not take heed of the threats and was considering delivering a response from its own territories rather than from allied groups in the region," Hajizadeh said.

Israeli officials reached out to their counterparts in some neighboring countries, begging them to convince Iranian armed forces to lower the intensity of their response, he added.

"If it were not for the Leader's willpower, no one would have dared to take such a measure. This operation was a strategic victory for us, and added a failure to Israel's long list of humiliations," Hajizadeh stated.

The IRGC launched extensive missile and drone strikes against the Israeli-occupied territories on April 13. The retaliatory strikes, dubbed Operation True Promise, inflicted damage on Israeli military bases across the occupied lands.

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
