FM Araghchi's New Details on Aggression Against Iran: Airspace of Countries Other Than Iraq Also Used

TEHRAN -- Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi said Wednesday Israel carried out its latest act of aggression against Iran using the airspace of other regional countries in addition to Iraq.

"The presence of the U.S. military in the region is a reality and the Zionist fighter jets carried out the recent attack against Iran through the airspace opened up by the United States in the region," Araghchi told reporters after a cabinet session.

Araghchi said Iran is following up on the complaint lodged by Iraq with the United Nations over Israel's use of its airspace for conducting the attack.

Iran is also in contact with other regional countries whose airspace has been used to carry out the attack, he added.

On Saturday, Israeli warplanes used U.S.-controlled airspace over Iraq to attack military installations in Iran's Tehran, Khuzestan, and Ilam provinces in flagrant breach

of the country's national sovereignty.

The Israeli aircraft used the space available to the U.S. military in Iraq to fire a number of missiles at Iran's radars in Ilam and Khuzestan provinces as well as several others stationed on the outskirts of Tehran province.

Iran has said it is resolved to respond to the recent Israeli act of aggression against the country and will not abandon its right.

A senior Iranian commander said Israeli, U.S., UK and French warplanes flew over Iraq for 25 consecutive days in preparation for the attack.

The Iraqi airspace was "at the disposal" of the Zionist regime and its supporters, including the U.S., Britain, France, and some littoral Persian Gulf Arab states for the aggression, Rear Admiral Habibollah Sayyari, deputy chief of the Iranian Army for Coordination, said.

Hundreds of manned and un-

manned warplanes, tanker aircraft, and electronic warfare aircraft flew across the Iraqi skies in preparation, he added.

"However, as a result of the readiness and alertness of our dear Air Defense and Air Force, a concerted operation took place that did not allow any of the enemy's advanced aircraft to cross our borders," he said.

Sayyari said the operation forced the hostile warplanes to fire ballistic missiles towards the Islamic Republic, while flying as far as 100 kilometers away from the country's borders.

A large number of the projectiles were destroyed by the Iranian air defenses, while only some managed to strike locations inside the country, he added.

"They knew that we are awake, alert, and battle-tested, and that our nation is familiar with these situations," Sayyari said.

Envoy Condemns Israeli Ban on UNRWA

NEW YORK (Dispatches) -- Iran's UN ambassador has slammed the Israeli decision to ban the UN agency for Palestinian refugees, UNRWA, calling it an attempt to block the delivery of desperately needed aid in Gaza.

"We strongly condemn the recent Israeli legislation to target UNRWA which seeking to block it from delivering critical support," said Amir Saeid Iravani who also slammed "Israel's unchecked impunity" for its systematic crimes in Gaza.

"UNRWA remains the backbone of all humanitarian response in Gaza. Its targeting denies Palestinians vital support and adds yet another layer of hardship during this crisis," Iravani wrote.

He added that Gaza "endures a relentless campaign of devastation and suffering. Over the past year, Israel's aggressive and genocidal acts have inflicted unprecedented damage on civilians in Gaza."

"The northern Gaza Strip is now under a brutal siege, and Israel's military operations have turned densely populated areas like Jabalia into active conflict zones, trapping civilians with no access to food, water, or medical care," he stated.

"This prolonged siege has forced civilians into impossible choices—flee under fire or risk death in place—while humanitarian aid remains blocked, in clear defiance

of international humanitarian law," he said.

"Civilians, including countless children and families, are being systematically deprived of essential services, facing starvation, lack of medical aid, and a constant threat of displacement. Israeli apartheid regime continues to use starvation as a weapon," Iravani noted.

"For over two weeks, all humanitarian aid to Gaza has been halted. The blockade has suspended efforts to deliver essential vaccinations and other life-saving services indefinitely," the Iranian envoy said.

He added that this act of "collective punishment," as recognized by the UN Secretary-General, directly contravenes the UN Charter and Israel's legal obligations.

UN chief Antonio Guterres also penned a protest letter to the Israeli Prime Minister.

Guterres warned against the devastating impact of the UNRWA ban on the humanitarian situation in Gaza and the occupied territories.

He reminded Israel that under international law an occupying regime must implement mechanisms for aiding the people living in that occupied territory.

"There is no alternative to UNRWA," Guterres said, adding, "The implementation of these laws would be detrimental to the resolution of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and for peace and security

Pezeshkian Congratulates Sheikh Qassem

TEHRAN -- President Masoud Pezeshkian has congratulated Sheikh Naim Qassem on his appointment as the secretary general of Lebanon's Hezbollah movement.

In a message, Pezeshkian paid tribute to late secretary general of Hezbollah Sayyed Hassan Nasrallah, who was martyred in an Israeli strike on September 27.

"Defending the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Lebanon, as well as the lofty ideals of the resistance front and the oppressed people of Palestine in this sensitive juncture is certainly of historical importance", Pezeshkian said.

The president expressed confidence that Sheikh Qassem's appointment would strengthen the resistance movement's resolve and lead to the continuation of the path of martyrs.

Pezeshkian also expressed hope that the Zionist regime's aggression would come to an end, and peace and security would be restored to Gaza, Lebanon and the entire region through the unity of the Islamic Ummah, and the increased support of Muslim countries, as well as the assistance of people with moral conscience worldwide.

He finally wished Sheikh Naim Qassem health and happiness, and success in his new post.

Sunni Politician Named Sistan-Baluchestan Governor

TEHRAN -- Two Sunni politicians have been appointed as the deputy president and the provincial governor in the country, Government spokeswoman Fatemeh Mohajerani said Wednesday.

Abdolkarim Hussein-zadeh, a 44-year-old Sunni politician, was appointed as deputy president for the affairs of the rural development and the disadvantaged areas, Mohajerani said.

Mansour Bijar, a Sunni Baluch politician, was approved by the cabinet as the governor of the southeastern province of Sistan-Baluchestan, she added.

President Masoud Pezeshkian's initial appointment of Hussein-zadeh as his deputy for rural areas about two months ago faced hurdles as lawmakers rejected his resignation from his constituency as a member of parliament.

The lawmakers finally approved the resignation on Wednesday with 156 votes in favor, 69 votes against and five abstaining.
