The Fast Approaching End of the Illegal Zionist Entity

Later, the Iranian First Vice Presi-

dent Muhammadreza Aref received the Uzbek prime minister before


their meeting. His visit includes meetings with Iranian officials and participation in a joint business meeting attended by economic authorities from both countries.

UK Arrests Another Iranian on **Politically-Motivated**

Accusations

LONDON (Dispatches) · British authorities have arrested another Iranian national over accusations of planning to target the Israeli embassy in London.

The 31-year-old suspect was taken into custody at an address in northwest London on Friday morning, police said.

It comes after three other Iranian men, aged 39, 44, and 55, were detained at addresses in the British capital on Saturday and four others at locations elsewhere across England.

Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi has categorically rejected the accusations.

In a post on X on Thursday, he said Tehran has not been informed of any allegations via proper diplomatic channels.

"We are seeing stories in the media that Iranian nationals are allegedly involved in a supposed plot to target the Israeli embassy in London," he wrote.

"Iran in no uncertain terms categorically rejects any involvement in such actions and confirms that we have not been informed of any allegations via proper diplomatic channels."

Araghchi said there is a history of third parties bent on derailing diplomacy and provoking escalation, resorting to desperate measures, including false flag operations, apparently referring to Israel. Iran, he said, stands ready to engage to shed light on what has truly transpired. "We reiterate that UK authorities should afford our citizens due process," he added. In April, Iran's Foreign Ministry spokesman Esmaeil Baghaei condemned as "baseless and unjust" accusations leveled by Britain that the Islamic Republic was connected with certain criminal groups in Europe. Baghaei said attributing the actions of certain groups to Iran is a clear blame game meant to cover up Britain's own destabilizing activities, particularly in West Asia. The spokesman said London repeated its unfounded claims without any evidence despite Tehran's calls for the UK to provide proof supporting its allegations.

Araghchi Calls for Regional Convergence at Iran-Arab Dialogue

DOHA (Dispatches) -- Iran has highlighted the West's double standards regarding nuclear weapons, saying it is "unacceptable" that Western powers raise concerns about Tehran's peaceful nuclear energy program while they overlook Israel's extensive nuclear arsenal.

Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi made the remarks in an address to the Fourth Round of Iranian-Arab Dialogues conference here on Saturday.

The top diplomat reminded that the Islamic Republic's nuclear energy activities ae a peaceful and legitimate pursuit in contrast to the nuclear weapons possessed by the Israeli regime.

Iran, he said, does not seek nuclear weapons and that weapons of mass destruction have no place in the country's security doctrine.

The foreign minister said Iran is one of the initiators of a nuclearveapon-free zone concept in Asia, calling on Western countries to nuclear weapons program and ar- gime itself has ruled out even that abandon their double standards re- senal and instances of its deadly prospect. garding nuclear proliferation.

"Iran is committed to the international non-proliferation regime," Araghchi said.

For decades, the United States, its European allies, and Washington's allied parties elsewhere across the globe have been using allegations of Iran's pursuing nonconventional arms to either enact or agitate anti-Iranian policies, including sanctions, and anti-Iranian discourse.

This is while Iran's leadership has categorically ruled out such endeavor in line with moral and religious imperatives.

The Islamic Republic's refusal to either pursue, develop or stockpiles such weaponry has also been unexceptionally proven during the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA)'s inspections, making the country the most-verified member of the United Nations nuclear watchdog.

Pointing to the Israeli regime's

across the West Asia region, the official said, "The existence of the Zionist regime remains the single greatest threat to peace in the re-

gion." He condemned the United States for supporting the regime unwaveringly and exponentially, calling Washington an accomplice in the regime's atrocities, including its acts of violence and injustice targeting Palestinians.

The foreign minister described the regime's ongoing genocidal and other aggressive measures as a direct attempt to erase the Palestinian nation.

Such a prospect, he said, would amount to complete colonial erasure of the Palestinian nation through the most horrific forms of violence and forced displacement.

He said the so-called "two-state solution" is a myth used to delay the realization of Palestinian rights for decades, adding the Zionist re-

To the shock of Benjamin Netanyahu and his genocidal clique, a White House official said in clear words on Saturday that the US does not need permission from Israel whether for the ceasefire with Yemen or for talks with the Islamic Republic of Iran.

Claim of Iranian Launchers Heading

to Russia 'Absurd'

TEHRAN -- Iran's permanent mission to the United Nations has categorically rejected accusations that the Islamic Republic is preparing to supply launchers for short-range ballistic missiles to Russia.

Citing two supply launchers for short-range ballistic missiles to Russia, Reuters claimed that Iran was preparing to deliver Fath-360 launchers to Russia, which would give Moscow additional firepower in the war with Ukraine.

The missiles have a range of 75 miles (120 km) and could be used to target Ukrainian frontline positions, nearby military facilities, and population centers close to Russia's border, Reuters

said.

Iran's mission said the allegation was "utterly absurd."

"We regret that Reuters persists in its habit of circulating baseless allegations against the Islamic Republic of Iran," it said in a statement.

"So long as conflict persists between the parties, Iran will abstain from rendering any form of military assistance to either side," it added.

The United States previously accused Iran of sending Fath-360 missiles to Russia last September on nine Russian-flagged ships. But reports at the time suggested the missile launchers had not been included in the shipment.

The Western security officials and the regional source, speaking anonymously to Reuters, alleged that the delivery of the launchers was imminent but declined to provide further details, including reasons for the apparent delay in their initial transfer. Faced with similar accusations

in the past, Iran's mission to the UN clarified in September that the Islamic Republic regarded as inhumane any military assistance to parties of the Ukraine conflict that would increase damage to lives and infrastructure.

Iran has said that the United States and its European allies have prolonged the war by sending advanced weapons to Ukraine.
