Zionist Collaborators Entrenched in Qatar & PGCC States

We are not sure whether Doha will summon up the courage to ask Zionist allies, the US and the UK, to withdraw their useless or more properly treacherous troops for not just silently watching Israel to attack Qatar, but collaborating with the aggressor by providing precise location of the targeted building and refueling the aircraft in midair for the return flight to Occupied Palestine – again over the airspace of Saudi Arabia, which also has American military bases for 'protection'.

Qatar says it has the right to retaliate Israel's dastardly bombing, as Muslim countries condemned the violation of its sovereignty and pledged solidarity with it, but without any promise to mount a coordinated attack on the illegitimate Zionist entity for its unabated crimes against humanity, including the genocide in Gaza.

It remains to be seen how Doha will militarily respond in the absence of any long range projectiles of its own or the impotence to challenge the Zionist enemy of the other five members of the 6-nation Persian Gulf Cooperative Council (PGCC), which only knows that joint security means serving the US by regularly reciting the 'mantra' of the UAE's illegal claim to three of Iran's islands.

Interestingly the PGCC was established in the early 1980s with US blessings during the midst of the 8-year American war against Iran through Saddam of the repressive Ba'ath minority regime of Baghdad, by portraying the Islamic Republic as a threat to regional security.

If only our Arab neighbours were to distinguish friends from foes on the basis of the Islamic ties which all of us share.

If they hadn't invited the treacherous US – the bosom pal of the archenemy of Arabs and Muslims (Israel) – and placed their wealth and all they possessed at the disposal of Washington.

If the Persian Gulf states had used their brains to determine that Iran had no intention to interfere in their affairs and was the safeguard against the designs of the US with firm conviction that Israel should be erased from the map of West Asia.

Iran's National Security Chief Ali Larijani Proposes: 'Joint Operations Command' by Muslim Nations Against Israel

TEHRAN -- Iran's top security official on Saturday called on Islamic countries to take concrete action against Israel and form a "joint operations headquarters," warning that holding summits without practical outcomes would only embolden further Israeli aggression.

"Warning to Islamic governments! Holding an Islamic conference full of speeches and without practical outcomes (like a UN Security Council session) is equivalent to ordering a new aggression by the Zionist regime," Ali Larijani, Secretary of Iran's Supreme National Security Council, wrote on his official account on X.

"At the very least, against the madness of this regime, establish a 'joint

operations headquarters,'" he added.

Larijani's remarks come ahead of an emergency meeting of Arab and Islamic leaders scheduled for Sunday and Monday in Doha, Qatar, where the ongoing Israeli military campaign is expected to top the agenda. The summit follows recent escalations involving Israel in the region.

Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian is expected to attend the summit, which Tehran views as a critical opportunity for unified Islamic action.

"Even this decision will make the master of this regime extremely worried, forcing him—out of panic for global peace and a Nobel prize(!)—to revise his orders to the Zionist re-

gime," Larijani wrote.

He further criticized the lack of support for Palestinians, particularly in Gaza. "You have done nothing for the hungry and oppressed Muslims of Palestine. At least take a small decision to prevent your own destruction," he said.

Larijani's warning reflects Iran's long-standing stance against Israel and its calls for collective Islamic resistance. Tehran has often criticized ineffectual international and regional responses to Israeli military aggressions, particularly in the Palestinian territories.

Iran does not recognize Israel and has provided political support to groups opposing it, including Hamas and Hezbollah.

Araghchi Hails Deepening Ties With Tunisia in Op-Ed

TEHRAN – Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi, in a commentary published in Tunisian media, highlighted the longstanding and close relationship between Iran and Tunisia, describing it as "based on brotherhood, mutual respect, deep religious and cultural commonalities, and shared international goals."

Araghchi wrote that "Tunisia, the cradle of civilization and culture on the southern shore of the Mediterranean, holds a lofty and special place in Iran's foreign policy."

He noted that the diplomatic relations between the two countries have endured for over six decades and "have always been imbued with a spirit of brotherhood, friendship and mutual understanding."

Referring to recent developments, Araghchi praised the "historic visit" of Tunisian President Kais Saied to Iran in June 2024,

which he described as "a turning point that opened a new chapter of comprehensive cooperation and confirmed the joint determination to strengthen bilateral ties."

He further emphasized the solidarity between Tehran and Tunis in the face of Israel's recent aggression.

"In the recent aggression of the Zionist regime against Iranian territory, the firm, principled and valuable support of the Tunisian government and people for the Islamic Republic of Iran demonstrated the depth of brotherly relations and unbreakable solidarity between the two nations."

Araghchi added that Tunisia's support "within the framework of shared principles of resistance against bullying and defending sovereignty and territorial integrity" is deeply appreciated by Iran.

On international issues, he stressed that Iran and Tunisia "have always been aligned and united in their firm opposition to foreign interference in the internal affairs of countries, support for the Palestinian cause, and resistance to the failed and wrongful attempts to normalize relations with the usurping Zionist regime."

These, he said, represent "proud common approaches of the two countries in responding to current developments."

Acknowledging that despite positive political relations, "the vast economic capacities between the two countries have not yet been fully utilized," Araghchi called for a "significant leap and renewed determination" to expand bilateral trade.

He outlined several steps underway (Continued on Page 7)

Decrepit MKO Buys Crowd for Rally in Desperate Bid to Appear Relevant

TEHRAN -- The terrorist Mujahedin Khalq Organization (MKO) orchestrated a rally in Brussels on Saturday funded by \$5 million from Israel, using paid European migrants—including Ukrainian war refugees—to artificially inflate attendance and project a false image of popular support.

While MKO claimed the crowd consisted of genuine supporters and members, documents and images published by the group itself revealed a significant presence of European migrants, particularly

Ukrainian refugees fleeing conflict.

The despised terrorist group reportedly relied on financial incentives and tourist packages to attract thousands of attendees in an attempt to mask its shrinking base.

Facing a severe crisis marked by an aging membership and minimal new recruitment, MKO sought to portray a youthful and dynamic organization.

Iranian sources said senior MKO officials instructed event organizers to identify 300 to

400 young men and women—preferably Iranian migrants or those resembling Iranians—and pay them between €300 and €350 each to attend the rally.

"These individuals, recruited through various channels including some institutions and companies, were brought in under direct orders from MKO leader Maryam Rajavi," the report said. Participants also included young recruits from India, Pakistan, and Arab countries.

MKO staged the event, using

India, Iran, Uzbekistan Hold First Trilateral Political Consultations

TEHRAN — Iran hosted the first round of trilateral political consultations with India and Uzbekistan, aimed at strengthening regional cooperation and connectivity, the Iranian foreign ministry said in a statement.

The meeting, held in Tehran at the level of Directors-General for Regional Affairs, was attended by Muhammad Reza Bahrami, Director-General for South Asia at Iran's Foreign Ministry; Anand Prakash, Regional Director at India's Ministry of External Affairs; and Ghulamjon Pirimkulov, Director-General for Cooperation with South Asian, Middle Eastern and African Countries at Uzbekistan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The three sides expressed satisfaction with the launch of the trilateral format and agreed to hold the meeting on a regular annual basis, the statement said, adding that the consultations aim to serve mutual interests and promote regional prosperity.

The delegations discussed expanding cooperation in transport and connectivity, with particular emphasis on the strategic role of regional ports and the International North-South Transport Corridor (INSTC). They also reviewed progress made during the third Chabahar Working Group meeting held in Mumbai in November 2024.

The three countries also exchanged views on regional issues and explored ways to enhance cooperation in the fight against extremism and terrorism, the statement added.
