Israel & US Trash Toothless Doha Declaration

It seems the only positive outcome of the one-day Doha Summit was Iran's presence at the president's level that yet again demonstrated Tehran's selfless and sincere efforts for regional and Islamic solidarity with emphasis on the existential threat to the Arab states of West Asia posed by the illegitimate Zionist entity.

There were, however, few takers to the just and principled stance of the Islamic Republic on the realities of the region and the dangers facing the Muslim world, due to the timid nature of governments for concrete action against the archenemy, mainly because of their unexplained awe of the US – godfather of all terrorism and Israel's accomplice in crimes against humanity.

The result was a toothless communique or declaration approved by participants of the 50-plus countries who did not even agree to close their airspace to Israeli flights or sever relations with it.

To the shock of Muslims throughout the world, they even endorsed the illogical two-nation solution that virtually legitimizes the usurpation of Palestine by the non-Semitic illegal Zionist migrants of Eastern Europe.

Iran rightfully distanced itself from these points of the 25-clause declaration by stressing that the "only genuine and sustainable solution is the creation of a single democratic state, established through a referendum with the participation of all Palestinians, both inside and outside the occupied territories, representing the entire Palestinian people."

Tehran also questioned the wordings of the Doha Declaration that called on the US to make 'peace' efforts and use its influence to prevent Israel from attacking any country, by pointing out that it is the US which in practice has perpetuated and supported the acts of aggression of the Zionist entity against the Palestinian people – and also the attack on Qatar as well as the 12-day war against Iran last June.

In view of this reality, the Islamic Republic of Iran believes that the US cannot be regarded as a credible or impartial party in advancing a just and sustainable peace in this conflict.

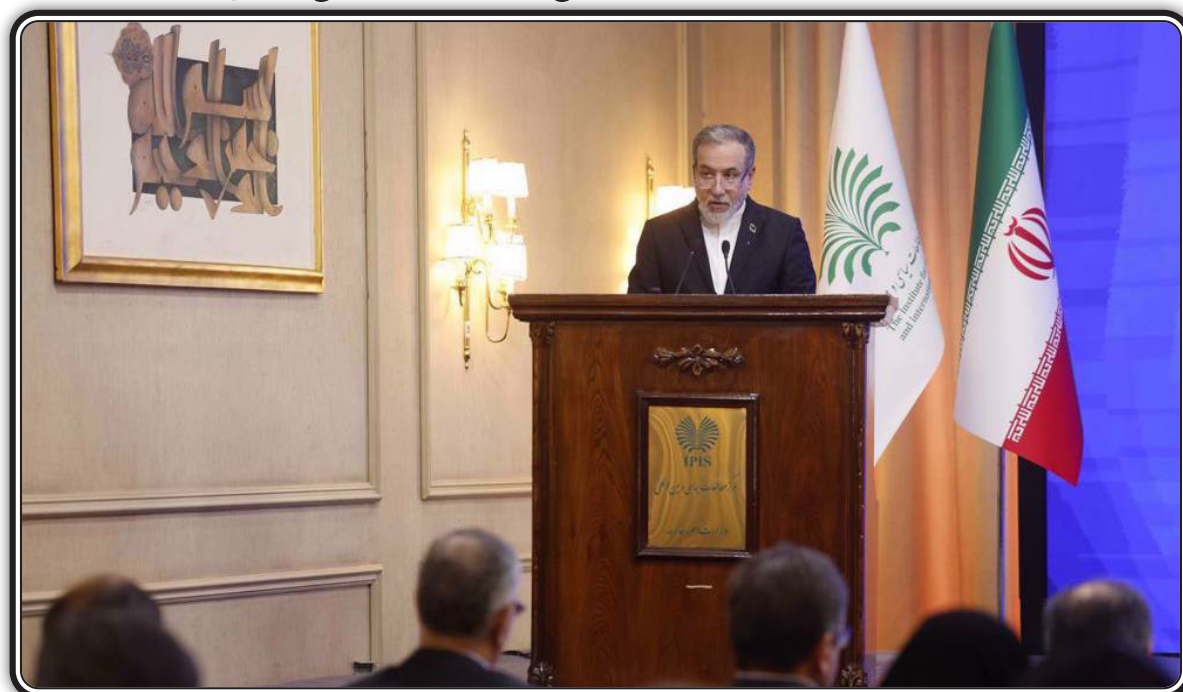
Israel quickly seized the opportunity to trash the Doha communique and worsen the genocide by starting its land invasion for complete occupation of Gaza City, already devastated and depopulated by almost two years of bombing.

At the same time it launched more aerial attacks on Yemen, especially on the Red Sea port city of Hodeida, while continuing its violations of Syria and Lebanon.

The US for its part showed its disrespect for Doha and other Persian Gulf Arab states, with its Secretary of State, Marco Rubio saying that Washington will soon force a 'defence' deal upon Qatar – as if the current one that abated the recent Israeli attack was not enough.

All this means the Arab states have renewed the mandate to the US to continue with its deceptions against them, and a free hand to the Zionist entity to attack them at will in pursuit of the satanic project to establish 'Greater Israel'.

FM Araghchi: ECO Should Play 'Leading Role' in Shaping New Regional Economic Order

TEHRAN - Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi says the Economic Cooperation Organization (ECO) can and should play a "leading" and "effective" role in shaping a new economic order in the West Asia region.

Araghchi made the remarks at the opening ceremony of the second edition of the Iran—Economic Cooperation Organization (ECO) Conference in the capital, Tehran, on Tuesday.

He stated that the ECO, whose members are Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Iran, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Turkey and Uzbekistan, has laid invaluable foundations for regional cooperation in recent years, but has yet to fully realize its vast potential.

"The current level of cooperation does not match the enormous capacities of the ECO region whatsoever," the top Iranian diplomat said. "The ECO can become a successful model of multilateral economic collaboration among neighboring countries."

"Iran believes ECO can and should play a leading and effective role in shaping the new economic architecture of the region," he added.

Araghchi also highlighted the strategic significance of cooperation with Central, South, and West Asian states, stating that such partnerships would bring undeniable added value to all ECO member states.

He underscored the need for collective decision-making and coordinated action to advance toward an "ideal ECO."

"We are in the process of formulating the vision plan for the next 10 years of ECO, as well as defining strategic goals and drawing paths to achieve them. This process has provided a good opportunity for collective action," Araghchi noted.

He highlighted that the 17th summit of the Eurasian organization in

the Azerbaijani city of Khankendi was also a manifestation of such a collective objective at its highest level.

The foreign minister noted that the organization provides a platform for member states to jointly address global economic fluctuations, geopolitical challenges, and rapid technological transformations.

He said the ECO could serve as a suitable framework to promote sustainable development, regional security, and shared prosperity.

"It is essential to draw on existing experiences and lessons learned from the implementation of previous vision plans, including Vision 2025, in formulating a new plan. ECO's Vision 2035 must be realistic, scientific, operational, and measurable to put the organization on a path to prosperity in the coming decade.

"To achieve such a goal, it is imperative to have a precise understanding

Envoy: Political Pressure Hindering Iran's Resolution to Shield Nuclear Sites From Attack

TEHRAN – Iran's Ambassador to the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), Reza Najafi, says member states have come under political pressure not to support Tehran's proposed resolution prohibiting attacks on nuclear facilities.

On Tuesday, Najafi addressed the issue of Iran's draft resolution aimed at prohibiting armed attacks against nuclear facilities, outlining the process behind the resolution, its objectives, and the challenges it faces.

He emphasized that this issue is

fundamental, as it has been historically recognized by the IAEA and has been discussed during review conferences of the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT). However, he noted that political pressures have hindered broader support for Iran's initiative.

The ambassador also warned that attacks on nuclear facilities—especially those housing nuclear materials—could lead to catastrophic environmental damage and serious public health risks. He highlighted

the urgent need for countries to back the resolution.

Najafi said that the draft resolution is expected to be put to a vote either Thursday or Friday. He noted that while Iran has actively sought support through diplomatic outreach in various capitals and in Tehran, U.S. pressure could sway the positions of certain countries, leaving the final outcome uncertain until the vote occurs.

He emphasized the resolution's significance, highlighting that the

Terrorists Martyr Two Police Officers in Southeast Iran

TEHRAN - Terrorists have attacked a police vehicle in Sistan and Baluchestan Province in southeastern Iran, martyring two officers and wounding another.

The attack took place on the highway linking the province's city of Khash and the provincial capital Zahedan on Tuesday, Sistan and Baluchestan's Police Information Center reported.

The "heinous" act was followed by a swift operation aimed at identifying and pursuing the perpetrators, it added.

According to officials, fur-

ther details and the results of the operation would be publicly announced at the earliest opportunity.

The officers hailed from the Sib and Suran County in the province's southeastern region, which lies approximately 400 kilometers from Zahedan.

Sistan and Baluchestan borders Pakistan. The province has witnessed multiple terror attacks targeting both civilians and security forces over the past years.

The Islamic Republic says the terrorists are linked to foreign intelligence services.

The overall situation has necessitated vigilant police and military presence and intervention on occasions.

In late August, provincial security forces killed at least eight terrorists responsible for an earlier attack on members of local law enforcement forces.

The attack had seen terrorists martyr five members of the law enforcement, targeting two police patrol units in the Daman District of Iranshahr County as the forces were on duty.

The so-called Jaish al-Adl terrorist group had claimed responsibility for the shooting.

Official: Israel's Aggression Against Qatar a Threat to Regional, Global Peace

TEHARN – Iran's Ambassador and Permanent Representative to the United Nations Office in Geneva, Switzerland, Ali Bahraini has condemned the Israeli regime's military aggression against Qatar, warning that if the international community remains inactive, this aggression and expansionism will spread like a "cancerous tumor," threatening the security of the entire region.

In a speech during the emergency session of the UN Human Rights Council on Tuesday, Bahraini said, "This aggression sends a clear message—not just about a regime with a history of systematic genocide and repeated acts of aggression, but as a serious warning to all of us. Our inaction and failure to uphold legal and moral principles have allowed a sinister entity to destroy global order and security."

He added, "This apartheid regime does not adhere to international law, does not understand the principles of civilized nations, and does not believe in negotiation, peace, or stability. The two-week cessation of violence and genocidal operations by the Israeli regime only occurred when the armed forces of the Islamic Republic of Iran intervened. If the international community does not respond decisively, Israel's aggression and expansionism will continue unabated, spreading like a cancer and threatening all countries in the region. We must protect our people and humanity by any means necessary."

The Iranian ambassador emphasized, "We reiterate our full solidarity with the people and government of Qatar and support all plans and initiatives aimed at holding Israel accountable."

An emergency session of the UN Human Rights Council for reviewing the Israeli regime's military aggression against the state of Qatar took place on Tuesday at the UN headquarters in Geneva. This session was convened at the request of a group of Islamic countries and the government of Qatar in response to the Israeli regime's attack on Qatari soil on September 9.
