Terrorist Trump Terrorizes the UN General Assembly

Larijani: Iran Open to Rational, Fair Proposal

TEHRAN - The secretary of Iran's Supreme National Security Council said Tehran is prepared to accept any rational and fair proposal that guarantees the country's interests, stressing that Iran will remain steadfast in defending its national security.

Speaking in a meeting with members of Iran's Chamber of Commerce in Tehran on Tuesday, Ali Larijani highlighted the constructive role of the private sector in foreign negotiations, noting that some talks could pave the way for resolving other outstanding issues as well.

He explained that Iran has exhausted all possible avenues to resolve the snapback dispute through dialogue, but Western parties have

obstructed the process with excessive demands.

Citing one example, Larijani said France conveyed through the IAEA director general that if Iran reached specific arrangements with the agency, Paris would withdraw its snapback demand. "That agreement was signed by our foreign minister in Egypt," Larijani noted, explaining that the special arrangements were necessary because some nuclear facilities had been bombed and could not be inspected under normal procedures. However, he added, the Western side failed to fulfill its promise.

Pointing to the West's record of reneging on commitments, Larijani said, "The problem lies in their abuse of contractual texts. Iran has

never avoided negotiations to resolve issues; even amid talks, they bombarded us. They chant slogans of negotiation, but in practice pursue other objectives. If a rational and fair proposal is presented that secures Iran's interests, we will accept it. But we remain committed and uncompromising when it comes to our national interests and security, just as we did regarding our missile capabilities."

The SNSC secretary stressed that Iran's chosen path stands in clear opposition to the destabilizing policies of the Zionist regime.

He concluded by underlining that Iran welcomes political, economic, and security cooperation with all regional countries and will continue to pursue that course.

Minister: No Third Party Can Interfere in Iran-Azerbaijan Interactions

TEHRAN - Iran's minister of roads and urban development Farzaneh Sadeq says no third country can dictate the nature of interactions between the Islamic Republic and Azerbaijan.

Speaking on Tuesday, Sadeq said no third party "can make decisions" concerning the bilateral relations, calling the "friendly and brotherly" countries the "main decision-makers" in the region.

The remarks echoed those of President Masoud Pezeshkian, who on Monday dismissed attempts aimed at sowing discord and disunity between Muslim nations, especially Iran and Azerbaijan.

She highlighted the positive results of ongoing talks and pointed to a bright outlook for bilateral cooperation, particularly in trans-

port, transit, and infrastructure.

The official noted that since the resumption of the countries' Joint Economic Commission last year after a three-year hiatus, six high-level meetings had taken place, demonstrating both sides' strong will to enhance ties.

Sadeq noted that following President Pezeshkian's visit to Baku, key obstacles lying in the way of the countries' economic relations, such as long-standing banking issues, were quickly resolved.

Direct flights between Baku and Iranian cities, including Tehran and Tabriz, were also launched and expanded, the official noted.

Among joint projects, Sadeq underlined the construction of a new border bridge connecting Iran to Aghbend in Azerbaijan. She said the construction was already un-

derway on the Azerbaijani side, and the bridge was expected to become operational by March 21.

The official also cited progress on a 107-kilometer "very strategic" highway joining the countries, calling it part of the East-West corridor, which will complement the North-South route and, therefore, enhance regional connectivity.

According to Sadeq, additional cooperation includes the Astara rail terminal, set to be fully operational within six months, as well as ongoing talks on electricity, energy swaps, and joint power plants.

She also reaffirmed shared cultural, religious, and historical bonds between the nations, and, overall, predicted a "promising horizon" for bilateral relations.

ICT Ministry to Launch Several Light Satellites This Year

TEHRAN - The Minister of Information and Communications Technology (ICT) says several light satellites from the Shahid Soleimani satellite constellation will be launched into space this year.

Speaking to reporters on Tuesday, Sattar Hashemi said the constellation will gradually reach maturity through phased launches.

"This year, a number of light satellites from the Shahid Soleimani constellation will be sent into

orbit," he said.

The minister emphasized that the Pezeshkian administration has prioritized purposeful launches and the provision of effective services to the public.

He noted that the development of the constellation's components is being carried out under the leadership of the Iranian Space Agency and the Space Research Institute.

"The launches are planned with both domestic and foreign launch-

ers," he added.

Hashemi highlighted the need for constant updates in the communications sector due to its dynamic nature. "If today a village is connected, with the advancement of technology generations, the needs of that area must also be updated," he said.

He added that satellite services must now provide high-quality and sufficient bandwidth, far beyond the minimal connections of the past.

EU3 Warned of Miscalculation Over Iran's Nuclear Issue

TEHRAN - Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi has cautioned that any miscalculation by the European troika or the Western governments regarding Iran's nuclear program could have serious consequences.

In a meeting on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly in New York, Araghchi and Omani Foreign Minister Badr bin Hamad Al Busaidi discussed the regional and international developments, including the situation in occupied Palestine.

The two ministers stressed the necessity of global action to halt the genocide of Palestinians and to hold the Israeli officials accountable in competent international courts.

Regarding Iran's nuclear program, Araghchi highlighted Tehran's responsible approach and reiterated that progress depends on the European parties' commitment to international obligations, including the lifting of unjust sanctions.

He warned that any miscalculation by the European or Western actors could trigger serious repercussions, underscoring Iran's readiness to defend its national interests.

Araghchi also had a meeting with International Atomic Energy Agency Director General Rafael Grossi to review the latest state of cooperation between Tehran and the IAEA.

In the meeting, held on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly in New York, Araghchi underlined Iran's goodwill and responsible stance on the nuclear issue.

He stressed that further progress depends on the accountability of other parties and an end to their excessive demands and misuse of the UN Security Council to pressure Iran.

Grossi, in turn, commended Iran's positive approach in its dealings with the IAEA, particularly the Cairo Understanding.

He also emphasized the importance of diplomatic efforts by all relevant actors to prevent escalation and maintain dialogue.

On September 10, Iran and the IAEA finalized an agreement on the continuation of cooperation under new conditions.

The agreement was reached in Cairo following weeks of negotiations.
