Capital Punishment Awaits Netanyahu and all **War Criminals**

The recent hanging of an effigy of the notorious Zionist childkiller and mass murderer, Benjamin Netanyahu, in Turkiyeh is indeed a welcome move needing urgent practical implementation.

The effigy that hangs from a crane beside a banner reading "Netanyahu Idam" meaning "Death penalty for Netanyahu is the growing demand of the people of not just the city of Trabzon or the whole Turkish nation, but also of all conscientious persons around the world, irrespective of their religion, ethnicity, nationality, and political leanings.

Those witnessing the scene, following the rulings of the International Court of Justice (ICJ) and the International Criminal Court (ICC) which have both confirmed the Gaza genocide, are all praise for what they describe as "a splendid spectacle" organized by Kemal Saglam, a professor of visual communication at Artvin Coruh University.

According to the Turkish media, the display took place on Saturday, October 25, at a construction site in the northern Turkish city where Saglam told local outlets that the symbolic hanging highlights Israel's human rights violations in Gaza.

He said the right to life of women, children, and innocent civilians in Gaza is being systematically violated by war criminal Netanyahu and his clique, which ought to be brought to justice.

The professor further said: "The world must not remain silent in the face of this crime. This act is symbolic. The real test must take place in international courts."

The question that arises is that: Do international courts have the power and the courage to arrest Netanyahu and hang him for his crimes against humanity?

If they lack such qualities then it is the right of conscientious people, including those of the original Jews living in Occupied Palestine and opposed to the violation of the tenets of Judaism by the non-Semitic criminals called the Zionists.

Netanyahu and his team of war criminals deserve revolutionary execution. There are so many ways to carry out the death sentence, such as pumping their accursed bodies with bullets, blowing up these terrorists through bombs, stabbing them to death with knives or any sharp instruments, and last but not the least heroically poisoning their food and drink.

We are sure the day will come when Netanyahu and all war criminals will meet the deserving capital punishment.

Iran, Pakistan Emphasize **Expanding Strategic Cooperation**

TEHRAN – High-ranking officials from Iran and Pakistan stressed the need to expand and develop strategic cooperation.

The visiting Pakistan's Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi met and held talks with Secretary of Iran's Supreme National Security Council (SNSC) Ali Larijani in Tehran on Tuesday.

During the meeting, the two sides explored the avenues for deepening and strengthening bilateral cooperation in the political,

security, and economic fields.

Strengthening the security position of the two countries in the current diplomatic equations and expanding strategic cooperation to maintain regional stability and security were the main topics discussed between the Iranian and Pakistani officials.

Pakistani minister arrived in Tehran to attend the first-ever Economic Cooperation Organization (ECO) Interior Ministers' meet-

The meeting aimed to focus on enhancing security and counterterrorism cooperation among the 10 member states of the ECO.

The 10 member countries of the ECO are Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Iran, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Tajikistan, Turkey, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan.

Earlier on Tuesday, the Omani interior minister met and held talks with Iran's top security official Larijani to discuss the expansion of bilateral relations.

Ministry: Interaction With IAEA in Accordance With Law Ratified by Parliament

TEHRAN – Iran's cooperation with the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) is based on the law passed by the Iranian Parliament in coordination with the Supreme National Security Council, the spokesperson for the Foreign Ministry said.

At his weekly press conference on Tuesday, Esmaeil Baghaei dismissed claims by IAEA Director General Rafael Grossi about secret negotiations.

He said the basis for Iran's cooperation and interaction with the IAEA is the law approved by the Parliament,

noting that Iran remains a member of the Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) and continues its engagement according to that legislation.

Baghaei stated that part of Iran's cooperation with the IAEA is routine, such as the replacement of fuel for the Bushehr nuclear power plant.

He stressed that under the current circumstances, the framework for cooperation is defined by the parliamentary law in coordination with the Supreme National Security Council

The NPT and the Safeguards Agreement form the foundation for Iran's interaction with the IAEA, just as for any other country, Baghaei added.

While UN Security Council Resolution 2231 was in effect, Iran voluntarily accepted time-bound commitments aimed at lifting unjust sanctions, however, Iran itself determines the scope and limits of its cooperation and will continue to act based on its obligations and the parliamentary legislation, the spokesman explained.

Judiciary: Iran's Security Self-Reliant, Not Dependent

TEHRAN - Judiciary spokesperson Asghar Jahangir says that Iran's security is entirely independent and self-reliant, not dependent on the permission or support of foreign

Speaking at a press conference on Tuesday, Jahangir highlighted Iran's missile program as a key example of this self-sufficiency.

The official described this as a major source of national pride, emphasizing that the missiles were developed domestically by Iranian

Jahangir also praised the role of the younger generation, noting that just as they once defended the nation's borders, but now through

their scientific and academic achievements, they are compelling adversaries to back down.

He noted that the notable successes of Iranian youth in both scientific and athletic arenas are building the foundation for a prosperous future.

Jahangir said 115 security convicts have so far been granted amnesty under a recent decree approved by the Leader, describing the move as having created public joy and excitement in various parts of society.

Jahangir explained that the pardon, which is based on specific criteria, will continue until late December, after which the final

number of beneficiaries will be an-

"We have previously expressed hope that with further reviews, the scope of the amnesty will expand so that more people can benefit from this Islamic clemency," he

Turning to the case of the seized Israeli ship, Jahangir said the case has been sent to court after an indictment was issued.

"For the ship's owner, who is accused of financing terrorism, a punishment equivalent to 170 million U.S. dollars has been requested," he told reporters.
