Vow of Vengeance Enters Practical Phase

The Vow of Vengeance of the Iranian nation for revolutionary execution of the two prime murderers of the innocents, Donald Trump of the US regime and Benjamin Netanyahu of the illegal Zionist entity, has entered the practical phase.

It means the free world will soon be celebrating the fulfillment of justice against this devilish duo for its crimes against humanity.

Ending the satanic life of the two most perpetrators of evil is an obligation for Iran, as well as conscientious people throughout the world, including in the US and in Occupied Palestine.

With the death sentence already passed, it is only a matter of time for implementing this logically justified verdict against the two chief terrorists in order to ensure international peace and deter any would-be terrorists from indulging in such sanguine crimes.

Capital punishment for Trump and Netanyahu is a national, religious, and civilizational duty and any laxity is carrying out is against the principles of the resistance movement.

The Leader of the Islamic Revolution in his message to the massive public commemorative gathering yesterday at the Tehran Mosalla for his martyred father, referred to patience, which certainly does not mean continuing unresponsive attitude towards oppression and oppressors.

He stressed that patience "is in no way incompatible with vengeance and confronting the world's evildoers involved in these grave crimes."

Ayatollah Seyyed Mojtaba Khamenei has formally declared vengeance for the sacred blood of Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei (RA) and the other martyrs of the two wars imposed by the US and Israel on the Islamic Republic of Iran, including the cold-blooded massacre of 168 girls of a primary school in the city of Minab.

Yesterday also saw the Iranian parliament echo with vociferous demands for end of the so-called Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the US through the mediation of Pakistan and execution of the perpetrators.

Some 180 Iranian lawmakers issued a statement declaring the Islamabad MoU violated by the US as effectively terminated, and vowed to avenge the blood of the Martyred Leader of the Islamic Revolution.

The MPs said, "we pledge in the parliamentary trench not to neglect for a moment the efforts, planning and practical measures in the path of blood revenge."

Two Members of Daesh Terrorist Group Executed in Iran for Armed Plot

TEHRAN -Two members of the Daesh Takfiri terrorist group, who were convicted of plotting to carry out acts of terror and armed rebellion against the Islamic Republic, have been executed after their death sentences were upheld by the Supreme Court of Iran.

Mohyeddin Abdollahi and Hussein Palani, identified as members of a Daesh terror cell that formed after the group's collapse in Iraq and Syria and had planned attacks inside Iran, were hanged on Tuesday, July 14, following the completion of legal procedures and the confirmation of their sentences by Iran's top tribunal.

Iranian security and intelligence forces detected the cell's hideout in the Bamo mountainous area on the border between Iraq's semi-autonomous Kurdistan region and Iraq,

and dealt a sharp blow to the terrorists.

Several militants were killed in the fierce exchange of fire, and three Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) servicemen were martyred.

The remaining Daesh terrorists were captured, and a considerable number of weapons, munitions, equipment and confidential documents were seized.

Following legal proceedings, including defense submissions from the accused and their lawyers, the court convicted the two individuals of armed rebellion against the Islamic Republic of Iran, and sentenced them to death.

The Supreme Court later reviewed and upheld the sentences, and the executions were carried out after all legal procedures were completed.

President Pezeshkian Hails Southern Iran's Resilience Amid Renewed U.S. Aggression

TEHRAN - President Masoud Pezeshkian on Tuesday praised the resilience of residents in southern Iran, describing the region as a long-standing symbol of resistance and national independence while expressing solidarity with communities affected by recent U.S. military aggression.

In a post published on his X account on Tuesday, the Iranian president said southern Iran has historically represented resistance against colonialism and the defense of the country's sovereignty.

"Throughout history, southern Iran has always been a symbol of resistance against colonialism and the safeguarding of independence,"

Pezeshkian said the people of the region are once again demonstrating patience and determination as they endure the consequences of "the enemy's aggression."

"Today, the honorable people of this land are overcoming the difficult days resulting from the enemy's aggression with patience, steadfastness, and perseverance. I stand with and appreciate these loyal and resilient people."

"Every part of Iran is my home," the president declared.

Pezeshkian's remarks came after the U.S. military launched a fresh wave of illegal and unprovoked strikes on the country's southern coastal region.

Iran's armed forces, in retaliation, targeted multiple sites of the U.S. military in the Persian Gulf region and Jordan with ballistic missiles and drones.

The United States has perpetrated numerous violations against Iranian territory since April 7, when Donald Trump, the U.S. president, an-

nounced a unilateral ceasefire in the latest bout of U.S.-Israeli aggression targeting the Islamic Republic.

The violations continued even after Washington and Tehran signed a Pakistan-mediated memorandum of understanding in June, the first clause of which clearly mandates cessation of aggression on all fronts.

The United States has also been trying to help vessels evade the maritime route designated by the Islamic Republic for safe and legal passage through the Strait of Hormuz by seeking to escort trespassing vessels through an illegal passageway.

Iran's Armed Forces have staged uncompromising retaliation in the face of each instance of violation, including those in support of illegal vessel movement in the Strait of Hormuz.

Tehran Condemns UK's Designation of IRGC as Security Threat

TEHRAN - The Iranian Foreign Ministry has strongly condemned the British government's decision to designate the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) as a "threat under the United Kingdom's National Security Act," describing the move as an "unjustified and irresponsible" measure that violates international law.

In a statement on Tuesday, the ministry said the decision contravened "the fundamental principles and rules of international law, including the principles of the sovereign equality of states and non-interference in the internal affairs of other countries."

It stressed that the IRGC was an integral component of the official Armed Forces of the Islamic Republic and, alongside the Iranian

Army, was responsible for safeguarding the country's territorial integrity, national sovereignty, and national security.

It also defended the force's regional role, saying its contributions to regional peace, security, and human dignity, particularly through its fight against the Daesh Takfiri terror group, were evident to all.

According to the statement, Britain's decision to apply such a designation to an official institution of a sovereign state is "a disgraceful and provocative act" that violates international law and the United Nations Charter.

The ministry added that the measure was particularly ill-timed given the current tensions in the West Asia region and criticized Britain's long history of interference in oth-

er countries' internal affairs.

The statement further said that the United Kingdom "has no moral standing to level accusations against others," reminding how the country had acted as "an accomplice and active participant" during the most recent bout of unprovoked American-Israeli military aggression against Iran.

Rejecting Britain's allegations against the IRGC, the ministry said it was "particularly ironic" that such claims had been used to try to justify the decision while the UK, itself, "hosts and supports terrorist and violent networks and groups."

Iran also warned that it reserves its rights under the UN Charter and international law to take reciprocal measures, adding that British

Iran Begins Repatriating 55 Fishermen Detained by UAE After GPS Disruptions

TEHRAN - Iran has begun repatriating 55 fishermen detained by the United Arab Emirates (UAE) after GPS disruptions during the U.S.-Israeli aggression caused their vessels to drift into Emirati waters, the Iranian embassy in Abu Dhabi announced.

The embassy said on Tuesday that 14 fishermen had already returned aboard the vessel Aria through Bastak Port.

It added that another 11 fishermen would return to Iran on Dubai-Mashhad flights in the coming days after receiving the necessary travel documents.

The fishermen, most of them from Hormozgan and Sistan and Baluchestan provinces, were detained by the UAE Coast Guard in March and April after GPS and vessel-tracking disruptions caused their boats to stray into Emirati waters.

The fishermen spent more than two months in detention at the Sweihan detention center and prisons in Ras Al Khaimah and Sharjah before being released.

The embassy said it had worked closely with Emirati authorities from the moment it became aware of the detentions, following the case on a daily basis and arranging return tickets for 44 of the fishermen.

Iran and the United Arab Emirates have periodically coordinated through consular channels to secure the release and repatriation of fishermen detained after inadvertently crossing maritime boundaries.

Iranian officials have said the recent U.S.-Israeli aggression against Iran triggered widespread disruptions to GPS and vessel-tracking systems across the region, causing numerous fishing boats to lose their bearings and contributing to a rise in such incidents.

Official Condemns U.S. Pressure Campaign Against ICC as 'Blackmail' to Suppress Justice

TEHRAN - Iran's deputy foreign minister for legal and international affairs Kazem Gharibabadi has condemned Washington's campaign to pressure countries into ending cooperation with the International Criminal Court (ICC), describing the effort as "overt blackmail and intimidation to suffocate justice."

Gharibabadi said in a post on X on Tuesday that the United States was seeking to shield American and Israeli officials and military personnel from accountability.

U.S. Authorities Detain American Journalist Max Blumenthal Upon Return From Iran

TEHRAN - American journalist Max Blumenthal says he was detained and questioned by US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) officers at Washington Dulles International Airport upon returning from Iran, with agents searching his belongings and confiscating his smartphones after he refused to provide access to them.

Blumenthal described the questioning and seizure of his devices as a politically motivated response to his reporting from Iran, saying, "As punishment for my factual journalism, I was subjected to political harassment by the Trump administration upon my return from Iran."

According to Blumenthal, CBP officers searched his luggage and demanded access to his mobile phones. After he declined to unlock the devices, the agents seized them.

He said the confiscation was intended to discourage his reporting on Iran, and that the officers repeatedly questioned him about his future travel plans.

"The seizure of my devices was a clear act of intimidation aimed at deterring me and others from doing (Continued on Page 7)
