Iran's Liberating Message for Brotherly Arab People

It described Jordan as "the resting place of the prophets" and urged Jordanians to end the presence of "the army of the Great Satan" on their soil.

Once Iran's projectiles reduce to rubble in entirely all US military bases and other American installations in the neighbouring countries, people's power will triumphantly emerge.

All of this is a sign of the unfolding peaceful revolution which Insha Allah (God Willing) make the whole region, including the Strait of Hormuz and the Persian Gulf littoral secure and stable from the US-Zionist designs.

'Malicious' and 'Hypocritical': Army Slams UK Designation of IRGC

TEHRAN — Iran's Army on Wednesday condemned the British parliament's move to designate the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) a national security threat, calling the decision a product of Britain's "malice, hypocrisy, and double standards" in confronting terrorism.

In a statement, the Army's Public Relations Office said Britain has "a long and dark history" of "creating divisions, fostering sectarianism, and supporting terrorism" in West Asia.

"The recent action by the UK Parliament in labeling the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) despite it being one of the world's largest anti-terrorism forces, stems from the 'malice, hypocrisy, and double standards' of British officials in confronting the scourge of terrorism around the world," the statement said.

The Army said the IRGC has

consistently been "at the forefront of the fight against terrorism," describing its record in combating militant groups in West Asia and safeguarding Iran's national and regional security as evidence of its role in counterterrorism.

"The Islamic Revolution Guards Corps has consistently been at the forefront of the fight against terrorism, and its historical record in combating terrorism in the West Asia region and safeguarding Iran's national and regional security stand as clear evidence of the Guards' and their personnel's tireless and selfless efforts," it said.

The statement also described the IRGC as "not only a military force but also a social and cultural force," saying it had provided services to the Iranian people and neighboring countries while supporting "Muslims and the oppressed."

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IRGC Fires Warning Shots at Two Unauthorized Vessels in Hormuz

TEHRAN — The Islamic Revolution Guards Corps fired warning shots at two vessels attempting to transit the Strait of Hormuz without authorization over the past 24 hours, as the country's designated shipping route through the strategic waterway continued to attract most commercial traffic, according to maritime data and Iranian authorities on Wednesday.

Data from maritime intelligence firm Kpler showed that nine of the 11 vessels transiting the Strait on Tuesday used the route designated by Tehran, with the ships mainly carrying crude oil, petroleum products, liquefied gas, methanol and iron ore linked to Iran's maritime trade.

Kpler said the vast majority of vessels using the strategic waterway are now sailing through the Iranian-designated corridor.

The warning shots followed similar incidents reported earlier this

week after Iranian authorities said vessels had attempted to use unauthorized routes through the Strait. The IRGC has previously warned it will take action against ships failing to comply with designated transit arrangements.

The developments come as the Persian Gulf Strait Authority (PGSA) said more than 200 non-Iranian vessels have coordinated with the authority to transit the Strait since the June 17 Islamabad Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Tehran and Washington.

The PGSA was established after the outbreak of the U.S.-Israeli war against Iran in late February as Tehran tightened oversight of shipping through and around the Strait of Hormuz.

Tensions have escalated in recent weeks following repeated U.S. violations of the June 17 agreement.

On July 7, Washington revoked a

license authorizing Iranian oil sales and launched airstrikes targeting Iran after Iranian forces moved to stop shipping using illegal routes in breach of the MoU.

The United States has since carried out multiple rounds of strikes against Iranian territory, while President Donald Trump declared the ceasefire "over" during a NATO summit in Ankara on July 8.

Tehran has since said it no longer considers itself bound by certain provisions of the accord, stating that Washington has "completely dismantled" the agreement.

Iran's parliament is also reviewing legislation that would formalize Tehran's control over the Strait of Hormuz by establishing a legal framework for managing the strategic waterway, underscoring what officials describe as Iran's determination to maintain authority over the passage despite U.S. pressure.

Iran Files Dossier of 42 U.S. Ceasefire Breaches at UN

NEW YORK (Dispatches) — Iran has formally complained to the United Nations that the United States is systematically violating a landmark ceasefire agreement, documenting 42 breaches and calling on the Security Council to take "immediate, effective, and decisive measures" against Washington.

In a letter to UN Secretary-General António Guterres and the Security Council on Tuesday, Iran's Permanent Representative Amir Saeid Iravani dismissed U.S. claims of

self-defense, declaring that "the United States is the aggressor—not the victim".

The complaint centers on the Islamabad Memorandum of Understanding, signed on June 17, 2026, and mediated by Pakistan, which was intended to end months of war and establish a framework for resolving outstanding disputes. The agreement included provisions for a permanent cessation of war, reopening the Strait of Hormuz, and lifting a U.S. naval blockade.

Iravani's letter, which Tehran has requested be circulated as an official Security Council document, states that Washington began undermining the agreement "almost immediately" after its signing.

The letter further asserts that the United States has "persistently failed to fulfil its commitments and has actively and systematically undermined the implementation of the Memorandum".

Iravani described the U.S. actions (Continued on Page 7)

Senior Official Denies Trump's Claim of 11-Hour Talks in Oman

TEHRAN — Iran's Deputy Foreign Minister for Legal and International Affairs Kazem Gharibabadi denied on Wednesday that Iranian and U.S. officials held talks in Oman, rejecting U.S. President Donald Trump's claim that the two sides had engaged in 11 hours of negotiations and saying Tehran would not initiate discussions with Washington following recent U.S. actions.

"There was no dialogue between Iran and the United States in Oman," Gharibabadi said in a televised interview. "Our discussions in Oman were solely with Omani officials and we had no negotiations with the

American side."

"The claim that there were 11 hours of negotiations with the United States is not true and is categorically denied," he added.

Gharibabadi also said Iran had presented Oman with a proposal for a new shipping route through the Strait of Hormuz while insisting that use of the southern navigation channel was unacceptable to Tehran under current conditions.

"We emphasized in Muscat that we will not accept the southern route of the Strait of Hormuz under any circumstances," he said.

The deputy foreign minister

said Iran's delegation traveled to Oman to explain Tehran's position to Omani officials and to ensure the issue did not become a dispute between the two neighboring countries.

"Our mission was to make clear to our Omani friends that the Islamic Republic of Iran has no intention of violating Oman's sovereignty," he said.

According to Gharibabadi, Iran requested that the southern shipping lane be temporarily suspended and proposed an alternative route developed in consultation with military commanders responsible for overseeing

Senior Commander: Iran's Military Stronger Than During 12-Day War

TEHRAN — A senior Iranian military commander said on Wednesday that Iran's armed forces are now stronger than they were during the 12-day war, saying the military has expanded its capabilities and drawn operational lessons from the U.S.-Israeli attacks on the country.

Rear Admiral Habibollah Sayyari, the Iranian Army's chief of staff and deputy coordinator, said the armed forces continue to strengthen their capabilities in line with the threats they face.

"We closely monitor threats and fully understand their depth. The Islamic Republic of Iran's Army increases its capabilities in proportion to the threats. And today, our capabilities are greater than those of the 12-day imposed war," Sayyari said.

He said the recent war has provided valuable lessons that are being used to improve the army's readiness, personnel and equipment.

"Today, we have reached a very good position both in terms of military personnel and in terms of equipment; we have also learned many lessons from recent wars, and we are using these lessons to further enhance the Army of the Islamic Republic of Iran," he said.

"Recent wars have provided us with major lessons, and applying them will be very effective in increasing our readiness," he added.

Referring to Iran's western borders, Sayyari said the country's forces remain prepared to confront any threat.

"Wherever the great Iranian nation and the soldiers guarding these borders are present, the enemy is mistaken if it believes it can carry out any action," he said.

The remarks came months after the United States and Israel launched another round of attacks against Iran on Feb. 28. Tehran responded with missile and drone strikes targeting Israeli positions and U.S. bases and interests across the region.

Separately, Major General Yahya Rahim Safavi, a senior military adviser to Iran's commander-in-chief, said the Axis of Resistance will continue to shape the region's security landscape and would ultimately prevail against any future U.S. or Israeli military action.

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
