Execution Brings Justice in 2022
Riot Killing of Security Officer

TEHRAN – Iran's judiciary announced on Saturday that the death sentence (qisas) against Arif Khoshkar, convicted of the murder of security force member Salman Amir-Ahmadi during the 2022 terrorist riots, has been carried out following legal procedures and the request of the victims' families.

The execution concludes a case that stemmed from violent riots in the Falah neighborhood of Tehran in 2022.

According to a statement from the judiciary's media center, a group of individuals had blocked roads and created disturbances, prompting security forces to intervene to restore order and reopen thoroughfares.

During the confrontation, the judiciary stated, individuals climbed onto rooftops and threw stones and bricks at security personnel. It was during this incident that Khoshkar, armed with a shotgun, opened fire on the

security forces.

Salman Amir-Ahmadi sustained severe injuries from buckshot to the head and was transported to a hospital, where he succumbed to his wounds.

Khoshkar was subsequently identified, arrested, and referred to the judicial system.

During the investigation and a reconstruction of the crime scene, the convicted individual confessed to being present at the location and firing the shot that killed Amir-Ahmadi.

"I had hidden the gun under my clothes and had also taken a hand grenade from a friend," Khoshkar stated in his confession, according to the judiciary report.

"We went to Abedi Alley, entered a house and went up to the roof. I took out the gun and fired. After that, I hid the gun again, left the location, and threw the gun into a trash can."

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Foreign Ministry: All Commitments Under U.S. Accord Suspended

TEHRAN – Iran has suspended all its commitments under the Islamabad Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the United States, which violated the agreement by resuming military aggression against Iranian territory, officials said on Saturday.

Foreign Ministry spokesman Esmail Baghaei said Iran has never been the first party to violate any agreement, stressing that as with the 2015 nuclear deal (JCPOA), it was the United States that first broke its commitments under the new memorandum.

He added that the agreement was based on reciprocal implementation of commitments, and no country can be expected to uphold its obligations unilaterally while the other side fails to do the same.

"We made it clear that commitment is met with commitment. Since the United States violated its obligations, Iran will not fulfill its commitments either, as this is a reciprocal action," Baghaei said.

Deputy Foreign Minister Kazem Gharibabadi said Washington has effectively abandoned all of its obligations under the 14-point agreement signed last month through Pakistani mediation, prompting Tehran to halt implementation of its own commitments.

"None of those commitments are currently being implemented," he said.

Baghaei emphasized that Paragraph 5 of the MoU clearly stipulated that Iran, in consultation with Oman and through dialogue with regional states, would be responsible for developing mechanisms for managing the strategic waterway.

He noted that the memorandum contained no provision allowing the United States to establish an independent shipping route or assume a separate management role in the Strait of Hormuz.

According to Baghaei, the agreement envisioned a 30-day period to restore normal shipping

conditions and implement safe navigation mechanisms. However, before that period expired, the United States launched military operations against Iran, bypassing the coordinated shipping routes established with Tehran.

He stressed that Iran's measures in the Strait of Hormuz were taken in line with its responsibility to safeguard maritime security and prevent the waterway from being used for military operations against the country. Under international law, Iran has the right as a littoral state to take necessary measures to protect its national security.

Regarding the future of talks with Washington, Gharibabadi said Tehran had been engaged in negotiations before the United States breached its commitments and resumed aggression last week.

"What lies before us now is the resolute defense of the country and teaching the aggressors a lesson," he said, adding that Washington

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Indictments Issued Against Reza Pahlavi, 300 Media Affiliates

TEHRAN – Iran's Judiciary said it has referred separate cases involving Reza Pahlavi and other accused individuals, as well as nearly 300 affiliates of the so-called Iran International and Manoto television networks, to Tehran's Revolution Court after issuing indictments.

Judiciary spokesperson Asghar Jahangir announced on Saturday that prosecutors had completed investigations into a case involving Reza Pahlavi and several other individuals following a complaint

filed by the Office of the Prosecutor General.

The case relates to activities carried out during the 2025 12-day war and the second U.S.-Israeli aggression in February, according to Jahangir.

The indictment includes charges such as cooperation with hostile states, espionage, collaboration with U.S. and Israeli spy agencies, directing terrorist networks, incitement to violence, complicity in killings, destruction of public and private property, and damaging

the country's infrastructure and economy, Jahangir stated.

Referring to a separate case, the spokesperson revealed that authorities have identified around 300 members and affiliates of the so-called Iran International and Manoto television networks.

He noted that indictments have also been issued against those individuals and that the case has been referred to the Tehran Revolution Court for trial.

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Yemen's Defense Chief Pledges Allegiance to Iran's Leader

SANAA (Dispatches) -- Yemen's Defense Minister Major General Muhammad Nasser al-Atafi has announced that Ansarullah is prepared to execute any orders issued by Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyyed Mojtaba Khamenei.

"We confirm the readiness of the armed forces to implement any directives issued by the Iranian supreme leader if the siege on the Yemeni people continues," al-Atafi said in an interview with Yemen's SABA news agency.

He also warned "aggressor countries, particularly the Saudi enemy and those who

support it," that Yemenis have all options available.

The announcement comes after Saudi warplanes struck Sanaa International Airport last Sunday in what the Sanaa-based Foreign Ministry described as a declaration of war, effectively ending a de-escalation period that had been in place since 2022.

Ansarullah responded on Monday with missile and drone strikes targeting Saudi Arabia's Abha International Airport.

Yemen's Ansarullah leader Abdul-Malik al-Houthi warned that "all Saudi oil facilities

and its vital installations are targets for Yemen's missiles and drones," adding that the Saudi enemy has trapped itself in its aggression against Yemen.

The Saudi-led coalition has imposed an air, land and sea blockade on Yemen since March 2015, triggering what the United Nations has described as one of the world's worst humanitarian crises.

Massive crowds took to the streets of Sa'ada on Friday to reiterate their support for the Sanaa government against Saudi aggression, expressing gratitude

U.S. 'Sinister Plot' Thwarted With Collapse of Southern Corridor

TEHRAN – Iran's judiciary chief said on Saturday that recent events in the Persian Gulf represent the "clearest evidence" of American strategic failure, asserting that the collapse of a U.S.-backed "southern corridor" plan has "nipped in the bud" what he called Washington's sinister scheme.

Judiciary chief Gholam-Hussein Mohseni Eje'i, in a social media, said the defeat of the southern corridor project had turned to an American dream of placing "chains of captivity" on Iran's borders into a "nightmare" for aggressors.

He added that recent enemy aggression against Iran should be understood within that framework.

The southern corridor refers to a shipping route along Oman's coastline that the U.S. military established in May to provide an alternative passage through the Strait of Hormuz, in order to challenge Iran's control of the strategic waterway under the Islamabad memorandum.

Iran responded initially with warnings and then targeting vessels which ignored them, ultimately bringing passage through the illegal corridor to zero.

Eje'i further stated that Iran's border guards and the "guardians of Hormuz" are defending not only geographical borders but also the country's "dignity and legal independence" against systematic aggression.

He asserted that the enemy's "treachery and malice" will be transformed into a historic defeat.

The confrontation follows a June memorandum of understanding brokered with Pakistani mediation, which had temporarily eased clashes after the war erupted on Feb. 28 with large-scale U.S.-Israeli terrorist strikes on Iran. However, that agreement has since frayed, with both sides accusing each other of violations.
