

At Least 20 Generals, Admirals, Civilian Defense Leaders Forced Out of Hegseth's Pentagon

ISTANBUL (Reuters) - Two Turkish-flagged commercial vessels collided off Istanbul in the Sea of Marmara on Wednesday and one of the ships, which had 10 crew on board, is believed to have sunk, the Istanbul governor's office and Turkish maritime affairs authority said. The Alsu, en route to the Aegean port of Aliaga, and Tugberk Imamoglu, en route to the Black Sea port of Karadenizregli, collided off the Silivri district of Istanbul at around 3 a.m. (0000 GMT), the Istanbul governor's office said in a statement. Coastguard ships and helicopters were sent to the scene for search and rescue, and there was no visible damage on the Alsu, the statement said. Authorities were unable to establish contact with the Tugberk Imamoglu and its 10 crew members.
